Purpose and Use of Contracts:

Contracts CC171501001 (Pitney Bowes, Inc.), CC171501002 (Neopost USA Inc.) and CC171501003 (Bell & Howell, LLC), are "preferred use" contracts established to make available mailing equipment, meter rentals, maintenance and supplies to Missouri state agencies and political subdivisions participating in the Missouri Cooperative Procurement program. These contracts replace C112169001 (Pitney Bowes, Inc.), C112169002 (Neopost USA Inc.) and C112169003 (Bell & Howell, LLC), which expired October 11, 2017.

State agencies are advised to check each contract for the purchase of these items and to choose the best product, best price, best delivery the various contracts make available to them. All contracts are "preferred use" contracts which means that the contracts have been bid with the goal of providing good market pricing and product variety to state agencies. CONTRACT TITLE: MAILROOM EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, & MAINTENANCE

CONTRACT PERIOD: OCTOBER 12, 2017 THROUGH OCTOBER 11, 2019

Contract CC171501001 is awarded by the State of Missouri consisting of the following:

- This Cooperative Contract Procurement including the attached State of Missouri Terms and Conditions (See Exhibit C)
- ❖ The attached NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, signed by the State of Arizona, Arizona Department of Administration State Procurement Office 5/9/17, as amended pursuant to Amendment No. One executed on July 24, 2017.
- ❖ The attached Participating Addendum (See Exhibit D)

The contractor shall provide mailroom equipment, supplies, and maintenance to the State of Missouri, state agencies political subdivisions and/or governmental entities at the firm, fixed prices/discounts specified in the State of Arizona Offer and Acceptance/Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897 and Bid Solicitation ADSPO16-169897. All references to the State of Arizona in the attached documentation shall be deemed to refer to the State of Missouri with the exception of information specific to the State of Arizona such as background information, statistical/factual information, etc.

The contractor shall submit invoices for mailroom equipment, supplies, and maintenance to the ordering State of Missouri entities at the address identified by the state agency in their account set-up information submitted to the contractor.

The State of Missouri's state agencies shall not utilize the "Term Rental (Installment Purchase) – Option A (Lease to Own)"

In general the purchase of mailroom furniture is unacceptable and only allowed when the state agency has obtained a waiver from Missouri Vocational Enterprises.

Federal Funds Requirement:

The contractor shall understand and agree that this procurement may involve the expenditure of federal funds. Therefore, in accordance with the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, Public Law 101-166, Section 511, "Steven's Amendment", the contractor shall not issue any statements, press releases, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money unless the prior approval of the state agency is obtained and unless they clearly state the following as provided by the state agency:

- the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money;
- the dollar amount of Federal funds for the project or program; and
- percentage and dollar amount of the total costs of the project or program that will be financed by nongovernmental sources.

Debarment Certification:

The vendor certifies by signing the signature page of this original document and any addendum signature page(s) that the vendor is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, voluntarily excluded from participation, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation under federal assistance programs. The vendor should complete and return the attached certification regarding debarment, etc., Exhibit A with their proposal. This document must be satisfactorily completed prior to award of the contract.

Reporting Requirement:

Upon request, at no cost to the state, the contractor shall prepare and submit a written report on an annual basis indicating purchases made by the state agency off the contract. This report must at minimum show items by contract item number, respective volumes purchased for each item, respective contract price and extended contract price; an annual total by item

and for all purchases must be shown. This report must be submitted to the Division of Purchasing at P.O. Box 809, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102, and directed to the Buyer's attention.

Executive Order 04-09, Offshore:

If any products and/or services offered under this RFP are being manufactured or performed at sites outside the United States, the vendor MUST disclose such fact and provide details with the proposal.

Pitney Bowes Inc. follows standard industry practices when sourcing certain components and products within the product solutions offered under this agreement. Our supply chain operation sources from multiple vendors within the United States and globally. Although certain components and products may be sourced globally, most of our product solutions provided to the end user are assembled or configured within the United States. In addition, certain levels of technical phone support may be performed offshore however an alternative on-shore service offering has been arranged and requires assistance from the end user's personnel. For example, when contacting our Customer/Product Support Services, our phone system provides the caller with an option for the caller to identify as a "government" account. The calls are then routed to our call centers located within the United States for immediate assistance. These services are performed by our personnel within the United States. When 877-213-7284 is dialed by the end user, during normal business hours, option 1 is for Customer/Product Support Services and option 3 is the option for Postage by Phone which are both staffed by onshore agents.

Cooperative Procurement Program:

The contractor agrees that various parties from the State of Missouri's Cooperative Procurement Program may utilize this Agreement, as, as set f orth in the N ASPO ValuePoint/S tate of A rizona Master A greement ADSPO16-169897, a s amended. The contractor shall provide mailroom equipment, supplies, and maintenance as described herein under the terms and c onditions, r equirements and s pecifications of t his Agreement, i neluding prices, t o o ther g overnment e ntities in accordance with the Technical S ervices A ct (section 6.7.360, R. SMo, which is available on the internet at: http://www.moga.mo.gov/mostatutes/stathtml/06700003601.html.) The contractor shall further understand and agree that participation by other governmental entities is discretionary on the part of that governmental entity and the State of Missouri bears no financial responsibility for any payments due the contractor by such governmental entities Technical Services Act, terms of this Agreement will govern.

- a) All equipment will be new and all replacement parts will be new.
- b) All shipping of equipment under warranty for repairs will be at the contractor's expense.
- c) All references to hours of the day will be deemed to be references to Central Time.
- d) Neither the State of Missouri, nor state agencies will purchase goods or services for overseas delivery or provide contractor with overseas support.
- e) Contractor may not sell and agencies may not purchase goods or services that are not included in this contract.

Affidavit of Work Authorization and Documentation:

Pursuant to section 285.530, R SMo, if the vendor meets the section 285.525, R SMo, definition of a "business entity" (http://www.moga.mo.gov/mostatutes/stathtml/28500005301.html?&me=285.530), the vendor must a ffirm the vendor's enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the services requested herein. The vendor should complete applicable portions of Exhibit B, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization. The applicable portions of Exhibit B must be submitted prior to an award of a contract.

Contractor's Personnel:

The contractor shall only employ personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws. This includes but is not limited to the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA) and INA Section 274A.

If the contractor is found to be in violation of this requirement or the applicable state, federal and local laws and regulations, and if the State of Missouri has reasonable cause to believe that the contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are

not eligible to work in the United States, the state shall have the right to cancel the contract immediately without penalty or recourse and suspend or debar the contractor from doing business with the state. The state may also withhold up to twenty-five percent of the total amount due to the contractor.

The contractor shall agree to fully cooperate with any audit or investigation from federal, state, or local law enforcement agencies.

If the contractor meets the definition of a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo, pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo, the contractor shall maintain enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the contracted services included herein. If the contractor's business status changes during the life of the contract to become a business entity as defined in section 285.525, R SMo, pertaining to section 285.530, R SMo, then the contractor shall, prior to the performance of any services as a business entity under the contract:

- 1. Enroll and participate in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the services required herein; AND
- 2. Provide to the Division of Purchasing the documentation required in the exhibit titled, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization affirming said company's/individual's enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program; AND
- 3. Submit to the Division of Purchasing a completed, notarized Affidavit of Work Authorization provided in the exhibit titled, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization.

In accordance with subsection 2 of section 285.530, RSMo, the contractor should renew their Affidavit of Work Authorization annually. A valid Affidavit of Work Authorization is necessary to award any new contracts.

Subcontractors:

Any subcontracts for the products/services described herein must include appropriate provisions and contractual obligations to ensure the successful fulfillment of all contractual obligations agreed to by the contractor and the State of Missouri and to ensure that the State of Missouri is indemnified, saved, and held harmless from and against any and all claims of damage, loss, and cost (including attorney fees) of any kind related to a subcontract in those matters described in the contract between the State of Missouri and the contractor. The contractor shall expressly understand and agree that he/she shall assume and be solely responsible for all legal and financial responsibilities related to the execution of a subcontract. The contractor shall agree and understand that utilization of a subcontractor to provide any of the products/services in the contract shall in no way relieve the contractor of the responsibility for providing the products/services as described and set forth he rein. The contractor must obtain the approval of the State of Missouri prior to establishing any new subcontracting arrangements and before changing any subcontractors. The approval shall not be arbitrarily withheld.

Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee:

The contractor shall pay a one percent (1%) administrative fee to the State of Missouri which shall apply to all payments received by the contractor for all mailroom equipment, supplies, and maintenance provided under the contract. Payment of the one percent administrative fee shall be non-negotiable.

The contractor shall pay the administrative fee at the end of each calendar quarter (i.e. March 31, June 30, September 30, December 31). The total administrative fee for a given quarter must equal one percent (1%) of the total payments (minus returns and credits) received by the contractor during the calendar quarter as reported on the contractor's Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report specified below. The administrative fee must be received by the Division of Purchasing (Purchasing) no later than the 15th calendar day of the month immediately following the end of the calendar quarter, unless the 15th is not a b usiness day in which case the next b usiness day thereafter shall be considered the administrative fee deadline.

Payments shall be made using one of the following acceptable payment methods:

• <u>Check:</u> Personal check, company check, cashier's check, or money order made payable to the "Missouri Revolving Information Technology Trust Fund" and sent to the following mailing address: Division of

Purchasing, P.O. Box 809, Jefferson City, MO 65102 – 0809 OR Division of Purchasing, 301 West High Street, Room 630, Jefferson City, MO 65101-1517. The contractor's payment by check shall authorize the State of Missouri to process the check electronically. The contractor understands and agrees that any returned check from the contractor may be presented again electronically and may be subject to additional actions and/or handling fees.

• <u>Electronic Payment:</u> Instructions on how to submit payments electronically by automated clearing house (ACH) will be provided upon request by contacting the Division of Purchasing at (573) 751-2387.

All payments of the administrative fee shall include the contract number on any check or transmittal document. However, only one contract number must be entered on a check or transmittal document. If submitting an administrative fee payment for more than one contract, then a separate check or electronic payment and associated transmittal document must be submitted by the contractor for each contract.

Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report:

The contractor shall submit a Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report to the Division of Purchasing which shall identify the total payments (minus returns and credits) received by the contractor from state agencies, political subdivisions, universities, and governmental entities in other states that were made pursuant to the contract.

The contractor shall prepare and submit the Missouri Statewide Contract Quarterly Administrative Fee Report at the end of each calendar quarter (i.e. March 31, June 30, September 30, December 31) for total payments (minus returns and credits) received by the contractor during the calendar quarter. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained herein. Any change must be accomplished by a formal signed amendment prior to the effective date of such change.

1. APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS

- a. The contract shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri (state). The contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the performance of the contract to the extent that the same may be applicable.
- b. To the extent that a provision of the contract is contrary to the Constitution or laws of the State of Missouri or of the United States, the provisions shall be void and unenforceable. However, the balance of the contract shall remain in force between the parties unless terminated by consent of both the contractor and the state.
- c. The contractor must be registered and maintain good standing with the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri and other regulatory agencies, as may be required by law or regulations.
- d. The contractor must timely file and pay all Missouri sales, withholding, corporate and any other required Missouri tax returns and taxes, including interest and additions to tax.
- e. The exclusive venue for any legal proceeding relating to or arising out of the contract shall be in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.
- f. The contractor shall only employ personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws and Executive Order 07-13 for work performed in the United States.

2. INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- a. The State of Missouri does not pay state or federal taxes unless otherwise required under law or regulation. Prices shall include all packing, handling and shipping charges FOB destination, freight prepaid and allowed unless otherwise specified herein.
- b. The statewide financial management system has been designed to capture certain receipt and payment information. For each purchase order received, an invoice must be submitted that references the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- c. The contractor shall not transfer any interest in the contract, whether by assignment or otherwise, without the prior written consent of the state.
- d. Payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears unless otherwise indicated in the specific contract terms.
- e. The State of Missouri assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any unauthorized quantity is subject to the state's rejection and shall be returned at the contractor's expense.
- f. All invoices for equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased by the State of Missouri shall be subject to late payment charges as provided in section 34.055, RSMo.
- g. The State of Missouri reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state purchasing card.

3. DELIVERY

Time is of the essence. Deliveries of equipment, supplies, and/or services must be made no later than the time stated in the contract or within a reasonable period of time, if a specific time is not stated.

4. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

- a. No equipment, supplies, and/or services received by an agency of the state pursuant to a contract shall be deemed accepted until the agency has had reasonable opportunity to inspect said equipment, supplies, and/or services, as set forth in the NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, as amended.
- b. All equipment, supplies, and/or services which do not comply with the specifications and/or requirements or which are otherwise unacceptable or defective may be repaired by contractor and if not required may be replaced or rejected all as set forth in the NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, as amended. In addition, all equipment, supplies, and/or services which are discovered to be defective or which do not conform to any warranty of the contractor upon inspection (or at any later time if the defects contained were not reasonably ascertainable upon the initial inspection) may be rejected as set forth in the NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, as amended.
- c. The State of Missouri reserves the right to return any such rejected shipment at the contractor's expense for full credit or replacement and to specify a reasonable date by which replacements must be received.
- d. The State of Missouri's right to reject any unacceptable equipment, supplies, and/or services shall not exclude any other legal, equitable or contractual remedies the state may have.

5. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Elected or appointed officials or employees of the State of Missouri or any political subdivision thereof, serving in an executive or administrative capacity, must comply with sections 105.452 and 105.454, RSMo, regarding conflict of interest.

6. WARRANTY

Contractor warrants that upon delivery the equipment rented hereunder will be in good working condition as set forth in the NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, as amended. If the equipment is not in good working condition upon delivery, Contractor shall promptly repair or replace the equipment at its sole cost and expense. If the equipment requires repair or replacement during the warranty period as set forth in the NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, as amended,, contractor will promptly repair or replace the equipment at its sole cost and expense; provided, however, if the repair or replacement is necessary due to the customer's abuse, misuse or neglect, the customer will be responsible for the cost of such repair or replacement. EXCEPT AS SET FORTH HEREIN CONTRACTOR DISCLAIMS ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, WITH RESPECT TO THE RENTAL OF EQUIPMENT.

7. REMEDIES AND RIGHTS

a. No provision in the contract shall be construed, expressly or implied, as a waiver by the State of Missouri of any existing or future right and/or remedy available by law in the event of any claim by the State of Missouri of the contractor's default or breach of contract.

b. The contractor agrees and understands that the contract shall constitute an assignment by the contractor to the State of Missouri of all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action that the contractor may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or the State of Missouri for which causes of action have accrued or will accrue as the result of or in relation to the particular equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased or procured by the contractor in the fulfillment of the contract with the State of Missouri.

8. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT

- a. In the event of material breach of the contractual obligations by the contractor, the state may cancel the contract. At its sole discretion, the state may give the contractor an opportunity to cure the breach or to explain how the breach will be cured. The actual cure must be completed within no more than 10 working days from notification, or at a minimum the contractor must provide the state within 10 working days from notification a written plan detailing how the contractor intends to cure the breach.
- b. If the contractor fails to cure the breach or if circumstances demand immediate action, the state will issue a notice of cancellation terminating the contract immediately. If it is determined Purchasing improperly cancelled the contract, such cancellation shall be deemed a termination for convenience in accordance with the contract.
- c. If the state cancels the contract for breach, the state reserves the right to obtain the equipment, supplies, and/or services to be provided pursuant to the contract from other sources and upon such terms and in such manner as the state deems appropriate and charge the contractor for any additional costs incurred thereby.
- d. The contractor understands and agrees that funds required to fund the contract must be appropriated by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri for each fiscal year included within the contract period. The contract shall not be binding upon the state for any period in which funds have not been appropriated, and the state shall not be liable for any costs associated with termination caused by lack of appropriations.
- e. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any leases entered into prior to the effective date of termination of the Participating Addendum shall continue for the duration of the lease term as stated in the lease.

9. BANKRUPTCY OR INSOLVENCY

Upon filing for any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding by or against the contractor, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the appointment of a receiver, trustee, or assignee for the benefit of creditors, the contractor must notify the state immediately. Upon learning of any such actions, the state reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to either cancel the contract or affirm the contract and hold the contractor responsible for damages.

10. INVENTIONS, PATENTS AND COPYRIGHTS

To the extent set forth in the NASPO ValuePoint/ State of Arizona Master Agreement ADSPO16-169897, as amended, the contractor shall defend, protect, and hold harmless the State of Missouri, its officers, agents, and employees against all suits of law or in equity resulting from patent and copyright infringement concerning the contractor's performance or products produced under the terms of the contract. This section shall only apply to the extent Contractor is the designer or manufacturer of goods provided hereunder.

11. NON-DISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

In connection with the furnishing of equipment, supplies, and/or services under the contract, the contractor and all subcontractors shall agree not to discriminate against recipients of services or employees or applicants for employment on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, disability, or veteran status unless otherwise provided by law.
