Whereas; NJPA issued an Request for Proposal #043012 (RFP) for the provision of POSTAGE METERS AND RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE, ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES to NJPA and NJPA Members nationwide; and

Whereas; PITNEY BOWES responded to said RFP committing to the provision of POSTAGE METERS AND RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE, ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES to NJPA and NJPA Members; and

Whereas; NJPA has awarded the contract proposed in the RFP, which is identified as NJPA contract 043012-PIT (the Contract), to Awarded Vendor, and

Whereas; NJPA and Awarded Vendor desire to further define their relationship under the Contract as contained herein.

Now therefore; In consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

The effective date of this Agreement shall be JUNE 19, 2012.

ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE AND INTENT

- 1.1 The purpose and intent of this Agreement is to:
 - 1.1.1 Augment the terms and conditions of the Contract #043012-PIT originally identified in the RFP, the Awarded Vendor's responses and modifications contained in Form C of the Awarded Vendor's bid response (all of which are hereby incorporated into this Agreement by this reference),
 - 1.1.2 Identify specific marketing and sales training responsibilities for both NJPA and Awarded Vendor, and
 - 1.1.3 To finalize the administration fee to be paid by the Awarded Vendor to NJPA.

ARTICLE 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

2.1 NJPA and Awarded Vendor agree to the terms and conditions contained in RFP #043012, the Awarded Vendor's responses AND the exceptions to those terms and conditions identified in Form C of Awarded Vendor's bid response EXCEPT as identified herein:

No further exceptions made.

ARTICLE 3. AWARDED VENDOR MARKETING RESPONSIBILITIES

3.1 Sales Force Training.

- 3.1.1 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for the facilitation of training for Awarded Vendor's appropriate sales force members, appropriate vendor's manufacturers' sales forces and appropriate levels of management by NJPA with regard to the use and value of the Contract.
- 3.1.2 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for facilitation of training their appropriate sales force and appropriate levels of management by Awarded Vendor regarding internal matters relevant to the Contract including, but not limited to, order process, product delivery, and funds flow.
- 3.1.3 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for identifying and organizing follow-up training(s) on these subjects as needed.
- 3.1.4 Awarded Vendor agrees to facilitate the meeting of specific appropriate marketing individual(s) to meet and plan overall marketing goals and initiatives.
- 3.1.5 Awarded Vendor will be responsible to allow opportunities for NJPA staff to meet with appropriate management and appropriate sales level staff of Awarded Vendor at national and regional functions.

3.2 Trade Shows.

3.2.1 Awarded Vendor will strongly consider exhibiting at the following national trade shows environments in cooperation with NJPA:

Participation will generally be through a display booth setting where Awarded Vendor will be responsible for the provision of personnel, marketing material, and equipment for the purposes of promoting this contract at various defined trade shows. Awarded Vendor will be responsible for co-branding marketing material distributed at these shows in the name of Awarded Vendor and NJPA. Awarded Vendor may request waiver of participation in any trade show Awarded Vendor feels is inapplicable to their Contract.

3.2.2 Awarded Vendor will give strong consideration to attending and displaying at additional trade shows recommended by NJPA.

3.3 Marketing Material.

- 3.3.1 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for creating, and up-dating as needed, marketing material co-branded by both Awarded Vendor and NJPA in both print and electronic forms for disbursement through various appropriate channels, such as the NJPA Cooperative Purchasing catalog, or as agreed to by both parties. Any such marketing materials or any notification or description of the Contract distributed by NJPA to Members shall be approved in advance by Awarded Vendor.
- 3.3.2 Awarded Vendor shall be granted use of the NJPA trademarks, service marks, logos, name or any other proprietary description of NJPA, whether registered or unregistered, subject to NJPA's prior approval. In addition, Awarded Vendor shall be

entitled to inform, both orally and in printed form, any and all prospects that Awarded Vendor has a contractual benefit relationship with NJPA for the purposes of serving NJPA members.

3.3.3 NJPA membership listings provided as a result of the Contract and this Agreement shall be confidentially used by Awarded Vendor and not disseminated to its customers or the business community.

3.4 Contract operations and delivery.

- 3.4.1 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for processing orders for contracted products and services requested from qualified and participating NJPA Members.
- 3.4.2 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for submitting calendar quarterly reports to NJPA showing the gross sales for each Participating NJPA Member or qualified Member sold during a quarterly time frame. (Article 6 6.1)
- 3.4.3 Awarded Vendor will be responsible to pay NJPA an administrative fee as defined herein.
- 3.4.4 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for maintaining current product/service and price lists with NJPA according to the terms and conditions of the Contract.
- 3.4.5 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for delivering technical assistance and education regarding the products/services purchased through the RFP and resulting Contract.
- 3.4.6 Awarded Vendor will be responsible for offering and promoting the Program and Contract to all current and qualified NJPA members.

ARTICLE 4. NJPA ADMINISTRATIVE/ MARKETING RESPONSIBILITIES

4.1 Sales Force Training.

- 4.1.1 NJPA will work with Awarded Vendor to identify the appropriate levels of management as well as the Awarded Vendor's sales force to be trained in the use and effectiveness of the Contract.
- 4.1.2 NJPA will provide personnel to train identified individuals in the use and effectiveness of the Contract in person on Awarded Vendor's site, or through webcast or webinar, where reasonable efficiencies of such training can be achieved.
- 4.1.3 NJPA will work with Awarded Vendor to identify ongoing training needs.

4.2 Trade Shows.

4.2.1 NJPA will work with Awarded Vendor to identify appropriate trade show venues for the promotion of the Contract.

4.3 Marketing Material.

- 4.3.1 NJPA will be responsible for assisting in the development of marketing brochures, as well as providing general support, retention, and assistance in the marketing of the program.
- 4.3.2 NJPA shall not use the trademarks, service marks, logo, name or any other proprietary description of Awarded Vendor, whether registered or unregistered, without Awarded Vendor's prior approval.

- 4.3.3 NJPA agrees to supply Awarded Vendor with access to NJPA Members through regular updates of its membership list and various communications. Awarded Vendor agrees that NJPA Members' list remain the property of NJPA and can only be used with prior permission of NJPA.
- 4.3.4 NJPA shall provide opportunity to participate in the NJPA catalog marketing program at no cost to Awarded Vendor.
- 4.3.5 NJPA agrees to promote the Awarded Vendor Contract as a new member benefit in NJPA publications.

4.4 Contract Operations and Delivery.

- 4.4.1 NJPA will be responsible for receiving available leads and forwarding of those leads to Awarded Vendor for follow-up.
- 4.4.2 NJPA will be responsible for acting as a liaison as necessary between NJPA Members and Awarded Vendor to communicate the NJPA message and resolve any contract issues.
- 4.4.3 NJPA will receive, evaluate, process, and respond in a reasonably timely manner to requests from Awarded Vendor for changes in prices and products covered by this contract.

ARTICLE 5. AUDITS

5.1 During the Term, Awarded Vendor will, upon not less than thirty (30) business days prior written request, make available to NJPA no more than once per calendar year, at Awarded Vendor's corporate offices, during normal business hours, the invoice reports and/or invoice documents from Awarded Vendor pertaining to all invoices sent by Awarded Vendor and payments made by NJPA members for all products purchased under this contract. NJPA may employ an independent auditor or NJPA may choose to conduct such audit on its own behalf. Awarded Vendor shall have the right to approve the independent auditor, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. Upon approval and after the auditor has executed an appropriate confidentiality agreement, Awarded Vendor will permit the auditor to review the relevant Awarded Vendor documents. NJPA shall be responsible for paying the auditor's fees. The parties will make every reasonable effort to fairly and equitably resolve discrepancies to the satisfaction of both parties.

ARTICLE 6. FEES

6.1 Awarded Vendor will pay NJPA an administrative fee of 1% (One Percent) of the sales resulting from NJPA #043012-PIT net of returns and allowances to NJPA or NJPA Members during each calendar quarter. Said administrative fees are to be paid within thirty (30) days after the end of each calendar quarter and commencing on the effective date of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7. MISCELLANEOUS

- 7.1 Notices. Notices permitted or required to be given hereunder shall be deemed sufficient if delivered to the address identified herein, or any updated address for which proper notice of address change has been affected. Notices may be delivered by hand or through the use of a third party delivery service. The sender is responsible for the documentation of delivery for any notice.
- 7.2 Entire Agreement. The individuals signing this Agreement hereby represent that they are authorized on behalf of their respective organizations to execute this Agreement and the Agreement contains the entire understanding between the parties concerning the subject matter.
- 7.3 Severability/Conflict. In the event that any of the terms of this Agreement are in conflict with any rule, law, statutory provision or are otherwise unenforceable under the laws or regulations of any government or subdivision thereof, such terms shall be deemed stricken from this Contract, but such invalidity or unenforceability shall not invalidate any of the other terms of this Contract. This Contract shall continue in force, unless the invalidity or unenforceability of any such provisions hereof does substantial harm to, or where the invalid or unenforceable provisions compromise an integral part of, or are otherwise inseparable from the remainder of this Contract.
- 7.4 <u>Waiver</u>. Failure by either party to take action or assert any right hereunder shall not be deemed a waiver of such right in the event of the continuation or repetition of the circumstances giving rise to such right.
- 7.5 Relationship of Parties. This agreement is not a contract of employment. The relationship between NJPA and Awarded Vendor is one of independent contractors each free to exercise judgment and discretion with regard to the conduct of their respective businesses. The parties do not intend this agreement to create and this agreement is not to be construed as creating a partnership, joint venture, master-servant, principal-agent, or any other relationship. Except as provided elsewhere in this agreement, neither party may be held liable for acts of omission or commission of the other party and neither party is authorized or has the power to obligate or bind the other party by contract, agreement, warranty, representation or otherwise in any manner whatsoever except as may be expressly provided herein.
- 7.6 <u>Indemnity</u>: Each party agrees that it will be responsible for its own negligent acts and the result thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the negligent acts of the other party and the results thereof. NJPA's liability shall be governed by the provisions of the Minnesota Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statutes, Section §3.736, and other applicable law. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any incidental or consequential damages of any kind under this Agreement.

LEASE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This is a lease with Pitney Bowes Global Financial Services LLC (PBGFS), Pitney Bowes' leasing company. PBGFS provides leasing options to our customers. PBGFS does not warrant, service or otherwise support the equipment. Those services are provided by Pitney Bowes Inc. (PBI) as stated in the Pitney Bowes Terms. Due to federal regulations, only PBI can own an IntelliLink Control Center or Meter. Therefore, those items are rented to you, rather than leased. Unlike the other equipment you may lease from us, you cannot purchase an IntelliLink Control Center or Meter at the end of the Agreement.

L1. DEFINITIONS

L1.1 All capitalized terms that are not defined in this document are defined in the "Definitions" section of the Pitney Bowes Terms.

- L2.1 You are leasing the Equipment listed on the Order. You will make each Quarterly Payment by the due date shown on our invoice.
- L2.2 You may not cancel this Lease for any reason. All payment obligations are unconditional.
- L2.3 Our remedies for your failure to pay on time or other defaults are set forth in the "Default and Remedies" section of the Pitney Bowes
- L2.4 You authorize us to file a Uniform Commercial Code financing statement naming you as debtor/lessee with respect to the Equipment.

L3. PAYMENT TERMS AND OBLIGATIONS

- L3.1 We will invoice you in advance each quarter for all payments on the Order (each, a "Quarterly Payment"), except as provided in any SOW attached to this Agreement.
- L3.2 Your Quarterly Payment may include a one-time origination fee, amounts carried over from a previous unexpired lease, and other costs.
- COSTS.

 L3.3 If you request, your IntelliLink® Control Center/Meter Rental fees, Service Level Agreement fees, and Soft-Guard® payments ("PBI Payments") will be included with your Quarterly Payment and begin with the start of the Lease Term. Your Quarterly Payment will increase if your PBI Payments increase.

L4. EQUIPMENT OWNERSHIP

L4.1 We own the Equipment. PBI owns any IntelliLink® Control Center or Meter. Except as stated in Section L6.1, you will not have the right to become the owner at the end of this Agreement.

L5. LEASE TERM AND INTERIM USAGE PERIOD

- L5.1 The Lease term is the number of months stated on the Order, plus any Interim Usage Period ("Lease Term"). The Interim Usage Period is the period between the date your Equipment is delivered and the first month of the subsequent calendar quarter.

 L5.2 If you use the Equipment during the Interim Usage Period, you agree to pay the prorated portion of your Quarterly Payment.

L6. END OF LEASE OPTIONS

- L6.1 During the 90 days prior to the end of your Lease, you may, if not in default, select one of the following options:
 - enter into a new lease with us;
 - purchase the Equipment "as is, where is" for fair market value;
 - return the Equipment, IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter (c) in its original condition, reasonable wear and tear excepted. If you return the Equipment, IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter, at our option you will either (i) properly pack them and insure them for their full replacement value (unless you are enrolled in the ValueMAX® program) and deliver them aboard a common carrier, freight prepaid, to a destination within the United States that we specify, or (ii) properly pack and return them in the return box and with the shipping label provided by us and, in either case, pay us our then applicable processing
- L6.2 If you do not select one of the options in Section L6.1, you shall be deemed to have agreed to enter into successive 12-month annual extensions of the term of this Agreement. You may opt to cease the automatic extensions by providing us with written notice within 120 days (but no less than 30 days or such shorter period as may be contemplated by law) prior to the expiration of the then-current term of this Agreement. Upon cancellation, you agree to either return all items pursuant to Section L6.1(c) or purchase the Equipment.

- L7. WARRANTY AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY
 L7.1 WE (PBGFS) MAKE NO WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED,
 INCLUDING ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY,
 FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, OR FREEDOM
 FROM INTERFERENCE OR INFRINGEMENT.

 - L7.2 PBI provides you with (and we assign to you our rights in) the limited warranty in the Pitney Bowes Terms.

 L7.3 WE ARE NOT LIABLE FOR ANY LOSS, DAMAGE (INCLUDING INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES), OR EXPENSE CAUSED DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY BY THE EQUIPMENT.

- L8.1 Condition and Repairs. You will keep the Equipment free from liens and encumbrances and in good repair, condition, and working order.
- L8.2 Inspection. We may inspect the Equipment and any related maintenance records.
- L8.3 Location. You may not move the Equipment from the location specified on the Order without our prior written consent.

L9. RISK OF LOSS AND VALUEMAX® PROGRAM

Because we own the equipment while you lease it from us, we need to make sure it is protected while it is in your possession. You can demonstrate to us that the equipment will be protected either by showing us that your insurance will cover the equipment or by enrolling in our fee-based ValueMAX program. The terms of that program are listed in Section L9.2.

L9.1 Risk of Loss.

- You bear the entire risk of loss to the Equipment from the date of shipment by PBI until the end of the Lease Term (including any extensions), regardless of cause, ordinary wear and tear excepted ("Loss").
- No Loss will relieve you of any of your obligations under this Lease. You must immediately notify us in writing of the occurrence of any Loss.
- You will keep the Equipment insured against Loss for its full replacement value under a comprehensive policy of insurance or other arrangement with an insurer of your choice, provided that it is reasonably satisfactory to us ("Insurance"). YOU MUST CALL US AT 1-800-243-9506 AND PROVIDE US WITH EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE WITH EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE.

L9.2 ValueMAX Program.

- If you do not provide evidence of insurance and have not enrolled in our own program (ValueMAX), we may include the Equipment in the ValueMAX program and charge you a fee, which we will include as an additional charge on your invoice.
- We will provide written notification reminding you of your insurance obligations described above in Section L9.1(c).
- If you do not respond with evidence of insurance within the time frame specified in the notification we may immediately include the Equipment in the ValueMAX program.
- If the Equipment is included in the ValueMAX program and any damage or destruction to the Equipment occurs (other than from your gross negligence or willful misconduct, which is not covered by ValueMAX), we will (unless you are in default) repair or replace the Equipment.
- If we are required to repair or replace the Equipment under the ValueMAX program and we fail to do so within 20 days of receiving your written notice of loss or damage, you may terminate this Lease.
- We are not liable to you if we terminate the ValueMAX program. By providing the ValueMAX program we are not offering or selling you insurance; accordingly, regulatory agencies have not reviewed this Lease, this program or its associated fees, nor are they overseeing our financial condition.

L10. MISCELLANEOUS

- L10.1 If more than one lessee is named in this Lease, liability is joint and several.
- You, and any principal, owner, officer or guarantor signing the Order or any documents executed in connection with this Lease, agree to furnish us financial information. Each of these persons authorizes us to obtain credit reports on them now and in the future
- YOU MAY NOT ASSIGN OR SUBLET THE EQUIPMENT OR THIS LEASE WITHOUT OUR PRIOR WRITTEN CONSENT, WHICH CONSENT WILL NOT BE UNREASONABLY WITHHELD.
- L10.4 We may sell, assign, or transfer all or any part of this Lease or the Equipment. Any sale, assignment, or transfer will not affect your rights or obligations under this Agreement.

- "Lease" the Order and the Lease terms and conditions attached to the Order.

- "Shipment Date" the date the Equipment leaves our facility or our agent's facility for delivery to you.
- "SLA" the Service Level Agreement.
- "SOW" a Statement of Work you enter into with us.
- "Third Party Equipment" equipment manufactured by a party other than us.
- "We," "Our," or "Us" the Pitney Bowes company with whom you've entered into the Order.
- "You," "Your," or "Customer" the entity identified on the Order.

G3. WARRANTY

G3.1 (a) PBI warrants that the PBI Equipment will be free from defects in material and workmanship and will perform according to the equipment user guide for a period of ninety (90) days from the Install Date (the "Warranty Period").

- (b) PBI warrants that the Maintenance Service provided will be performed in a professional and workmanlike manner.
- As your sole remedy in the event of a warranty claim, we will either repair or replace the Equipment or, in the case of defective Maintenance Service, reperform the Maintenance Service.
- A "defect" does not include the failure of rates within a rate update to conform to published rates.
- There is no warranty for Equipment requiring repair or replacement because of your negligence, usage which exceeds PBI's recommendations, damage in transit, virus contamination or loss of data, misuse, external forces, loss or fluctuation of power, fire, flood, or other natural causes, or service by anyone other than PBI. There is no warranty for Equipment arising from the use of third party supplies (such as ink) that results in: (i) damage to PBI Equipment; (ii) poor indicia, text, or image print quality; (iii) indicia readability failures; or (iv) a failure to print indicia, text, or images.
- The print engine(s), print engine components, structural components and printed circuit board assemblies supplied with the PBI Equipment may be reclaimed, reconditioned or remanufactured. Any such item is warranted to perform according to the same standards as the equivalent new item.
- The warranty does not cover Consumable Supplies.
- G3.2 EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY STATED IN THIS AGREEMENT, WE (ON BEHALF OF OURSELF AND OUR SUPPLIERS) MAKE NO OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE WITH RESPECT TO THE EQUIPMENT OR SERVICES PROVIDED.
- THIRD PARTY EQUIPMENT. G3.3 PBI MAKES NO REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY AS TO ANY THIRD PARTY EQUIPMENT. PBI AGREES TO PASS THROUGH TO YOU ALL THIRD PARTY EQUIPMENT WARRANTIES THE FXTFNT SUCH WARRANTIES TRANSFERABLE.

G4. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- PBI'S TOTAL LIABILITY (INCLUDING ANY LIABILITY OF G4.1 ITS SUPPLIERS) IS LIMITED TO THE FEES PAID BY YOU TO PBI FOR THE APPLICABLE EQUIPMENT OR SERVICES IN THE 12 MONTHS BEFORE THE EVENT THAT GIVES RISE TO THE CLAIM, EXCEPT FOR THE LIQUIDATED DAMAGES THAT MAY BE APPLICABLE TO SLA TIER 3 (SEE SECTION S2.3 OF THE SLA)
- NEITHER PBI NOR ITS SUPPLIERS IS LIABLE FOR ANY G4.2 DAMAGE YOU MAY INCUR BY REASON OF YOUR MISUSE OR NEGLIGENT USE OF THE EQUIPMENT, OR YOUR NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS.
- G4.3 NEITHER PBI NOR ITS SUPPLIERS IS LIABLE FOR ANY INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER, INCLUDING COMMERCIAL LOSS, OR LOST PROFITS, DATA, OR GOODWILL, FOR ANY MATTER RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT.

G5. DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

- G5.1 <u>Default</u>. You are in immediate default if you do not make any payment when due, you breach any other obligation under this Agreement, you become insolvent or file for bankruptcy, or are in default under any agreement with PBI or PBGFS.
- G5.2 Remedies. Upon your default, we may:
 - (a) cancel this Agreement and any other agreements PBGFS or PBI has with you;
 - (b) require immediate payment of all payments due under a Lease(s) or other agreements, whether accrued or due in the future;
 - (c) disable the IntelliLink Control Center or Meter;
 - (d) require you to return the Equipment and IntelliLink Control Center or Meter;
 - (e) if you do not return the Equipment and IntelliLink Control Center or Meter, require you to make immediate payment of an amount equal to the remaining value of the Equipment, IntelliLink Control Center or Meter at the end of the Lease Term, as determined by us;
 - (f) charge you a late charge for each month that your payment is late;
 - (g) charge you interest on any late payment from its due date until paid in full at the lesser of 18% per year or the maximum rate allowed by law;
 - (h) charge you a check return fee for payments made by you with insufficient funds;
 - reasonably attempt to mitigate our damages and costs in the event of your default, although you acknowledge that we are not obligated to do so; and
 - (j) pursue any other remedy, including repossessing the Equipment without notice to you. By repossessing the Equipment, IntelliLink Control Center or Meter, we are not waiving our right to collect the balance due.
- G5.3 <u>Enforcing Our Rights.</u> You agree to pay all our costs, including attorneys' fees, in enforcing our rights under the Agreement with you.
- G5.4 <u>Suspension of Services</u>. PBI reserves the right to suspend any services during any period in which your account is more than thirty (30) days past due.

G6. TAXES

You agree to pay Pitney Bowes for all charges and taxes G6.1 (other than taxes on or measured by net income), calculated as set forth below, related to the Lease or based on or measured by the lease transaction, payments under the Lease, the Equipment or Equipment location, the Meter or Meter location or services provided in connection with the lease transaction, including but not limited to sales/use and property type taxes. Pitney Bowes will determine the value of the Equipment, the value of the Meter and the amount of such taxes to be charged to you. Such determinations will reflect a reasonable value of the Equipment or of the Meter or the actual taxes and depreciation thereon. The taxes and depreciation to be charged on the Equipment and the Meter may reflect certain average tax rates, different depreciation schedules or some other calculation. You agree to pay a processing, billing and tracking fee and administrative charge to be determined by Pitney Bowes which may not bear a relationship to the tax charged or services performed, but

such fee and charge shall in no event exceed in the aggregate \$35 for each year for each Lease schedule.

G7. EMBEDDED SOFTWARE

G7.1

Our Equipment may contain embedded software. You agree that: (i) PBI and its licensors own the copyrights and other intellectual property in and to the embedded software; (ii) you are licensed only to use the embedded software with our Equipment in which the embedded software resides; (iii) you will not copy, modify, de-compile, or otherwise attempt to unbundle, reverse engineer or create derivative works of the embedded software, except as permitted by applicable law; (iv) you will not distribute or otherwise disclose the embedded software (or any portion thereof) to any other person; and (v) you may not export the embedded software in contravention of applicable export control laws. The embedded software contains third party software, which, notwithstanding the above, is subject to any terms that may accompany such third party software.

G8. INTERNET ACCESS POINT

G8.1 The Connect+ Series Equipment may use an internet access point (e.g., wireless router) provided by us. You may only use this access point for connectivity between the Connect+ Series Equipment and the internet and for no other purpose. You agree to pay all costs associated with use of the access point in violation of this restriction.

G.9. MISCELLANEOUS

- G9.1 <u>Force Majeure</u>. We are not responsible for any delay or failure to perform resulting from causes beyond our control.
- G9.2 <u>Assignment.</u> You may not assign this Agreement without our prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any purported assignment is void.
- G9.3 No Right to Setoff. Payments are not subject to setoff or reduction.
- G9.4 Legal Action. ANY LEGAL ACTION YOU FILE AGAINST US MUST BE STARTED WITHIN ONE (1) YEAR AFTER THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO YOUR CLAIM. YOU WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT.
- G9.5 Merger; Amendment; Severability. The Agreement incorporates all of the terms agreed by both parties and can only be changed by written agreement. You may use a purchase order to offer to obtain Equipment or services but you agree that none of the provisions of your purchase order will add to, modify or supersede these provisions unless we expressly agree in writing. If one or more provisions of this Agreement are deemed to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not be affected.
- G9.6 Survival. Our respective rights and obligations under Section G4 (Limitation of Liability), G5 (Default and Remedies) and G6 (Taxes) survive termination of the Agreement.
- G9.7 <u>Choice of Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Delaware without regard to its conflicts of laws principles.

SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT (SLA)

The following provisions describe the Service Level Agreement ("SLA") tiers that PBI offers on Covered Equipment (excluding software). The SLA tier you select will be listed on the Order. A separate Software License and Maintenance Agreement ("SMA") covers software maintenance and will be attached to the Order if you are acquiring software.

S1. DEFINITIONS

All capitalized terms that are not defined in these provisions are defined in the "Definitions" section of the General Terms.

S2. SERVICE LEVEL TIERS

The following describes the three SLA tiers offered by PBI for the Covered Equipment.

S2.1 Tier

(a) <u>General</u>. Under Tier 1, PBI will provide at its option either repair or replacement services for the Covered Equipment during the Initial Service Term or any Renewal Service Term (as defined in Section S4.2) (the "Maintenance Service Term"). You are also entitled to two preventative maintenance service calls per calendar year. PB will notify you when preventative maintenance is due or preventative maintenance service calls may be made at your initiation.

- (b) <u>Obtaining Service</u>. You can obtain service online or by telephone as set forth in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms.
- (c) Replacement Service.
 - If PBI determines that replacement is necessary, PBI will, at no additional cost, promptly ship new,

- reconditioned, or remanufactured equipment of the same or a functionally equivalent model to replace the affected Covered Equipment.
- (ii) Within five (5) days of receiving the replacement equipment, you must pack the Covered Equipment to be replaced in the shipping carton that contained the replacement equipment, place the pre-paid return address label on the carton, and return it to PBI.
- (iii) You are responsible for the return of Covered Equipment until PBI receives it.

(d) Repair Service.

- (i) If PBI determines that repair service is necessary, PBI may provide repair by remote access, diagnostics and coordinated remote service, or by on-site repair service.
- (ii) Repair service is provided only for damage resulting from normal wear and tear. Repair service may include the use of new, reconditioned, or remanufactured parts and assemblies.
- (iii) PBI will provide parts or assemblies for discontinued equipment (or equipment not marketed as new) only if available.
- (iv) If PBI deems it necessary, PBI will dispatch a service technician to arrive at your location for onsite service. You will not incur hourly charges unless service is performed outside Normal Working Hours, which will be done only with your consent.

S2.2 Tier 2

- (a) If you select Tier 2, we will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 1, PLUS:
 - (ii) Ongoing Equipment Training Services. PBI will provide the following training. PBI will schedule the training at a time convenient for you and PBI. Training will include an overview for the operator(s) on how to use the Covered Equipment. The number of training sessions that are included during each twelve (12) month period during the Maintenance Service Term are as follows:
 - Mail finishing products (which includes Meters and scales) - up to six (6) training sessions;
 - (2) Mail finishing accounting software solutions up to four (4) training sessions;
 - (3) Mail creation hardware products (which includes tabletop folders, tabletop inserters, and address printers) - up to four (4) training sessions; and
 - (4) Distribution solutions hardware products up to four (4) training sessions.
 - (iii) <u>Additional Covered Items</u>. PBI will provide printheads for Meters or Covered Equipment without additional charge.

S2.3 Tier 3

- (a) If you select Tier 3, PBI will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 1 and Tier 2, PLUS:
 - (ii) Preventive Maintenance Services.
 - (1) PBI will perform maintenance on the Covered Equipment at regular intervals.
 - (iii) Response Time Commitment.
 - (1) If PBI determines that on-site service is necessary, PBI will use commercially reasonable efforts to have a service technician on-site within four (4) hours (during Normal Working Hours only) of PBI's receipt of the call at the Customer Care Center (the "Response Time Commitment").
 - (2) The Response Time Commitment relates solely to the arrival of a technician at your location; it is not a guaranteed resolution of the problem within the four (4) hour time period, nor does it guarantee that

- all parts necessary to make a repair will be on-site within this time frame.
- (3) The Response Time Commitment does not apply to Service designated as service by replacement, software maintenance, preventive maintenance, operator training, or other services not essential to repair the Covered Equipment. These services will be scheduled in advance.
- (4) If the Covered Equipment is moved from its original location, PBI may remove the Response Time Commitment. If this happens, you will receive a refund equal to the difference between the cost of the Response Time Commitment and the cost of maintenance coverage without this obligation.
- (iv) <u>Liquidated Damages for Failure to Meet Response</u> Time.
 - (1) PBI agrees that if it does not meet the Response Time Commitment, PBI will provide you with a credit equal to six (6) months of the cost of the premium of the Response Time Commitment.
 - (2) You must use a credit request form in order to request a credit. You may obtain a credit form from your service technician or by calling the Customer Care Center. The credits are limited to credits for two (2) failures to meet the Response Time Commitment in any twelve (12) month period during the Maintenance Service Term. The remedies described in this Section are your sole remedy for PBI's failure to meet the Response Time Commitment.

S2.4 Connect+ Advantage

- If you select Connect+ Advantage, PBI will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 2 PLUS:
 - (ii) If you select Tier 3 in addition to Connect+ Advantage, coverage provided under Tier 3.
- (b) Connect+ Advantage is only available for items listed with a # next to the description.

S3. FEES

- S3.1 You will pay the fees for the Initial Service Term, and any Renewal Service Term(s). These fees are incorporated into your payment cycle (e.g., Quarterly Payment for leased equipment).
- S3.2 <u>Late Fees.</u> Our remedies for your failure to pay on time are set forth in the "Default; Remedies" section of the General
- S3.3 <u>Fees for Services Not Covered by this SLA</u>. If the service technician provides service for repairs caused by one of the conditions listed in Section S6.1(a)(ii), PBI will charge you for the service at PBI's current hourly rates and for any required parts.

S4. MAINTENANCE SERVICE

- S4.1 <u>Term.</u> PBI will provide you with Maintenance Service for the Initial Service Term and any Renewal Service Terms.
- S4.2 <u>RENEWAL SERVICE TEŔM(S)</u>. MAINTENANCE SERVICE AUTOMATICALLY RENEWS FOR CONSECUTIVE ONE (1) YEAR TERMS (EACH, A "RENEWAL SERVICE TERM"), UNLESS:
 - (a) YOU TERMINATE MAINTENANCE SERVICE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION S4.3 AT LEAST SIXTY (60) DAYS PRIOR TO THE RENEWAL OF THE TERM; OR
 - (b) YOUR LEASE EXPIRES OR IS TERMINATED (IN WHICH CASE, THE MAINTENANCE SERVICE TERM WILL TERMINATE ON THE SAME DAY AS THE LEASE); OR
 - (c) THE RENEWAL IS PROHIBITED BY APPLICABLE LAW.

S4.3 <u>Ending Your Maintenance Service</u>.

(a) If you do not wish to renew Maintenance Service, you must deliver a written notice (including your account number) (the "Termination Notice") by Certified Mail™ to the address listed in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms. Your Termination Notice must include your customer account number and lease

- number (if applicable), and is effective ten (10) business days after PBI receives it.
- (b) PBI reserves the right not to renew your SLA at any time and for any reason.

S4.4 Maintenance Service Changes.

- (a) PBI may modify its Maintenance Service by giving written notice to you (a "Maintenance Change Notice"), which will state whether the change is material.
- (b) After receiving a Maintenance Change Notice, if the change is material, you may terminate Maintenance Service as described in Section S4.3 above.

S5. WARRANTIES; LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

S5.1 The warranty for the Equipment and services as well as PBI's Limitation of Liability are set forth in the applicable section of the General Terms.

S6. ADDITIONAL MAINTENANCE TERMS

- S6.1 These terms apply to all Maintenance Service tiers:
 - (a) Limitations. Maintenance Service does not include:
 - (i) software maintenance and/or updates; and
 - (ii) services and repairs that are made necessary due to:
 - (A) negligence or accident, damage in transit,
 - virus contamination and loss of data;
 (B) use of Covered Equipment in a manner not
 - authorized by this SLA or the Equipment user guide;
 (C) natural causes such as fire or flood as well as
 - (C) natural causes such as fire or flood as well as other causes outside of PBI's control;
 - (D) use of Covered Equipment in an environment with unsuitable humidity and/or line voltage;
 - (E) loss of electrical power, power fluctuation, operator error;
 - (F) sabotage, repair or attempted repair by anyone other than PBI;

- (G) the use of third party supplies (such as ink), hardware, or software resulting in: (i) damage to the Equipment; (ii) poor indicia, text, or image print quality; (iii) indicia readability failures; or (iv) a failure to print indicia, text, or images;
- (H) failure to use applicable software updates; or
- use of Covered Equipment with any system for which PBI has advised it will no longer provide support or has advised is no longer compatible.
- (b) <u>Additional Exclusions</u>. Unless covered under one of the above maintenance tiers, Maintenance Service excludes the supply of rate program software for electronic scales and weighing systems, software maintenance and/or updates and consumable supplies for all levels of service, including printheads for Meters and IntelliLink Control Centers.

(c) Replacement Equipment.

- (i) If you replace any of your Covered Equipment during the Maintenance Service Term, and the replacement Equipment qualifies for maintenance services, PBI will automatically enroll you for maintenance coverage on the new Equipment at PBI's then current annual rates.
- (ii) If you acquire an attachment, or add a unit, to your Covered Equipment, PBI will provide coverage for any qualifying attachment or unit and adjust your rate accordingly.
- (iii) If you choose not to continue coverage on the replacement Equipment, attachment or unit, you may cancel Maintenance Service with respect to the item within thirty (30) days of the date of your initial invoice for the item from PBI. If you cancel, any further maintenance or repair services on the Equipment, attachment or unit will be subject to PBI's current rates.

EQUIPMENT AND POSTAGE METER RENTAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following provisions apply whenever you acquire an IntelliLink[®] Control Center or Meter from Pitney Bowes. Other terms may also apply, depending on the transaction.

R1. DEFINITIONS

All capitalized terms that are not defined in these provisions are defined in the "Definitions" section of the General Terms.

R2. EQUIPMENT RENTAL AND INTELLILINK® SUBSCRIPTION (METER RENTAL)

R2.1 <u>Fees</u>.

- a) If you are not leasing the Equipment and paying for it in your lease payment to PBGFS, we will invoice you the Equipment rental ("rental") and IntelliLink Subscription fees listed on the Order.
- (b) After the Initial Term, we may increase the rental and IntelliLink Subscription fees upon 30 days' prior written notice.
- (c) When you receive notice of an increase, you may terminate your rental only as of the date the increase becomes effective.

R2.2 Postage.

- (a) To obtain postage for your Meter, you must contact our Postage By Phone® data center.
- (b) You may transfer funds to the Bank for deposit into a Postage By Phone® Reserve Account that you maintain at the Bank ("your Reserve Account") or you may transfer funds to the United States Postal Service ("USPS") through a lockbox bank ("Lockbox Bank"). See the "USPS Acknowledgment of Deposit" section of the General Terms for more information.
- (c) After the Initial Term, we may increase postage refill fees upon 30 days prior written notice.
- (d) If you participate in any PBI, PBGFS, or Bank postage advance programs (such as Purchase Power®), we will advance payment on your behalf to the USPS, subject to repayment by you under the terms of the postage

advance program and billed separately from your IntelliLink Subscription fees.

R2.3 Meter Repair or Replacement.

(a) If the Meter malfunctions or fails due to reasons other than your negligence or accident, usage which exceeds our recommendations, damage in transit, virus contamination or loss of data, misuse, external forces, loss or fluctuation of power, fire, flood, or other natural causes, service by anyone other than us, or the use of third party supplies (such as third party ink) resulting in damage to the Meter, we will repair or replace the Meter.

R2.4 Terms of Use; Federal Regulations.

- (a) You may use the Meter solely for the purpose of processing your mail, provided that you are authorized by the USPS to use the Meter, and that you comply with (i) this Agreement, (ii) any user documentation and (iii) all USPS regulations.
- (b) You agree to use the Equipment and Meter only for business or commercial purposes, and not for personal, family, or household purposes.
- (c) You agree to use only attachments or printing devices authorized by us.
- (d) You must receive our written consent before moving the Equipment or Meter to a different location.
- (e) Federal regulations require that we own the Meter.
- (f) Tampering with or misusing the Meter is a violation of federal law.
- (g) Activities of the USPS including the payment of refunds for postage by the USPS to customers will be made in accordance with the current Domestic Mail Manual.
- (h) If the Meter is used in any unlawful scheme, or is not used for any consecutive 12 month period, or if you take

the Meter or allow the Meter to be taken outside the United States without proper written permission of USPS Headquarters, or if you otherwise fail to abide by the postal regulations and this Agreement regarding care and use of the Meter, then this Agreement and any related Meter rental may be revoked. You acknowledge that any use of this Meter that fraudulently deprives the USPS of revenue can cause you to be subject to civil and criminal penalties applicable to fraud and/or false claims against the United States. The submission of a false or fraudulent statement can result in imprisonment of up to 5 years and fines of up to \$10,000 (18 U.S.C. 1001) and a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 plus an assessment of twice the amount falsely claimed (3 U.S.C. 3802). The mailing of matter bearing a fraudulent postage meter imprint is an example of a violation of these statutes.

- (i) You are responsible for immediately reporting (within 72 hours or less) the theft or loss of the Meter to Us. Failure to comply with this notification provision in a timely manner may result in the denial of refund of any funds remaining on the Meter at the time of loss or theft.
- (j) You understand that the rules and regulations regarding the use of this Meter as documented in the Domestic Mail Manual may be updated from time to time by the USPS and it is your obligation to comply with any rules and regulations regarding its use.

R2.5 Rate Updates and Soft-Guard Program.

- (a) Your Meter or Equipment may require periodic rate information updates that you can obtain under our Soft-Guard program, or you will receive individual rate updates as a separate charge.
- (b) If you have purchased a Soft-Guard Subscription, we will provide up to 6 rate updates during each 12 month period following the date of installation of the Equipment.
- (c) We will provide rate updates only if required due to a postal or carrier change in rate, service, ZIP Code™ or zone change.
- (d) Your Soft-Guard Subscription does not cover any change in rates due to custom rate changes, new classes of carrier service, or a change in ZIP Code or zone due to Equipment relocation.
- (e) If your Soft-Guard Subscription has expired, or if you have received the maximum number of rate updates

under your Soft-Guard Subscription, you will be billed for any additional rate update you request.

(f) You can also renew the Soft-Guard Subscription by contacting PBI online or by telephone at the address and numbers set forth in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms.

R2.6 Warranty.

a) The warranty for the Equipment and services is set forth in the "Warranty" section of the General Terms.

R2.7 Limitation of Liability.

(a) PBI's limitation of liability is set forth in the "Limitation of Liability" section of the General Terms.

R2.8 Collection of Information.

- (a) You authorize us to access and download information from your Meter. We may disclose this information to the USPS or other authorized governmental entity.
- (b) We will not share with any third parties (except the USPS or other governmental entity) individually identifiable information that we obtain about you in this manner unless required to by law or court order.
- (c) We may elect to share aggregate data about our customers' postage usage with third parties.

R2.9 <u>IntelliLink® Control Center/Meter Care and Risk of Loss</u>

- (a) You agree to take proper care of the IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter(s) as stated in this Agreement and any user documentation.
- (b) You assume all risk of loss or damage to the IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter(s) while you have possession.

R3. VALUE BASED SERVICES

Value Based Services include services such as USPS[®] e-Return Receipt and USPS[®] Confirmation Services.

R3.1 *Fees*.

- (a) Any fees charged by the USPS for any Value Based Service you purchase are payable by you in the same way that you pay for postage.
- (b) The USPS is solely responsible for its services.
- (c) We are not responsible for any malfunctions of any part of the communication link connecting the IntelliLink Control Center with the USPS data system.
- R3.2 <u>Ending the Value Based Services</u>. We have the right to terminate the Value Based Services if the USPS discontinues offering the service or you breach your obligations under this Agreement and fail to cure the breach within thirty (30) days after you have been notified of it in writing.

UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF DEPOSIT

UI.1 In connection with your use of a Postage Evidencing System as defined in the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR"), you may transfer funds to the USPS through a lockbox bank (the "Lockbox Bank") for the purpose of prepayment of postage on Postage Evidencing Systems, generating evidence of postage, both PC Postage and meters (a "Deposit"), or you may transfer funds to the Bank for deposit into a Postage By Phone® Reserve Account ("your Reserve Account") which you maintain at the Bank.

UI.2 To the extent you deposit funds in advance of the use of any evidence of postage, you may, from time to time, make Deposits in the Lockbox Bank account identified as "United States Postal Service CMRS-PB" or make deposits in your Reserve Account, in either case through electronic means, including Automated Clearinghouse Transfers. The USPS may, at its discretion, designate itself or a successor as recipient of Deposits made by you to the Lockbox Bank account described above.

UI.3 Any deposit made by you in your Reserve Account is subject to the Postage By Phone® Reserve Account – Agreement and Disclosure Statement governing your Reserve Account.

UI.4 Any Deposit made by you in the Lockbox Bank account shall be credited by the USPS only for the payment of evidence of postage. Such Deposits may be commingled with Deposits of other customers. You shall not receive or be entitled to any interest or other income earned on such Deposits.

UI.5 The USPS will provide a refund to you for the remaining account balances of Deposits held by the USPS. These refunds are provided in accordance with the rules and regulations governing deposit of funds for evidence of postage, published in the CFR.

UI.6 The Lockbox Bank, which shall collect funds on behalf of the USPS, shall provide PBI, on each business day, information as to the amount of each Deposit made to the USPS by you, so that PBI can update its records.

UI.7 PBI may deposit funds on your behalf. The USPS will make no advances of funds to you. Any relationship concerning advances of funds is between you and PBI, PBGFS and/or the Bank.

The USPS rules, regulations, and orders shall prevail in the event of any conflict with any other terms and conditions applicable to any Deposit.

(a) Your Purchase Power Account (the "Account") will be charged for the amount of postage, products, and services requested and the related fees, if applicable.(b) Unless prohibited by law, you agree to pay the fees and charges of which the Bank has given you notice, including, without limitation, the fees and charges relating to: (i) transaction fees, if applicable; (ii) your failure to pay in a timely manner; (iii) your exceeding your credit line; and (iv) fees attributable to the return of any checks that you give to the Bank as payment of the Account.

EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED HEREIN, WE MAKE NO OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED.

X2. CUSTOMER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- X2.1 Letters. As of the date of this Agreement: for Letters, you will meter your Program Mail at the USPS rates set forth in the Additional Terms and Conditions. NO REPRESENTATION IS MADE AS TO THE AMOUNT OF YOUR MAIL THAT WILL QUALIFY FOR PRESORT MAILING RATES, AND YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR METERING YOUR PROGRAM MAIL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT REGARDLESS OF THE AMOUNT OF YOUR PROGRAM MAIL THAT QUALIFIES OR DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR PRESORT RATES. YOU HEREBY ASSIGN ANY AND ALL OF YOUR RIGHTS TO RECEIVE ANY POSTAGE REFUNDS OR REBATES BASED ON THE AMOUNT OF YOUR MAIL THAT QUALIFIES FOR ANY ADDITIONAL PRESORT MAILING RATES TO PBI (OR ITS SUBSIDIARIES) AND ALL SUCH REFUNDS OR REBATES WILL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF AND BE RETAINED BY PBI (OR ITS SUBSIDIARIES).
- X2.2 Flats. You will prepare and process your Flats as described in the Additional Terms and Conditions. You are responsible for metering all Flats that meet the criteria detailed in the Additional Terms

and Conditions at the current USPS 3 digit First-Class flat rate. You agree that we will invoice you through your Purchase Power Credit Line at the rate set forth in the Additional Terms and Conditions. We will bill you for the difference between the USPS regular flat rate and the 3 digit USPS First-Class flat rate for any Flats that do not comply with the requirements outlined in the Additional Terms and Conditions.

X2.3 <u>General</u>. You will have your Program Mail ready for pickup at your designated locations and in accordance with the schedule we mutually agree upon from time to time. You agree that time is of the essence with respect to each of your obligations for which time is a factor. You will ensure that your Program Mail complies with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to, all USPS regulations, and you will promptly execute any and all documents required by the USPS. You will ensure that your mail comp

lies with the requirements set forth in the Additional Terms and Conditions.

X3. GENERAL TERMS

L1. DEFINITIONS

L1.1 All capitalized terms that are not defined in this document are defined in the "Definitions" section of the Pitney Bowes Terms.

L2. AGREEMENT

- L2.1 You are leasing the Equipment listed on the Order. You will make each Quarterly Payment by the due date shown on our invoice.
- L2.2 You may not cancel this Lease for any reason except as expressly set forth in Sections L10 and L11 below. All payment obligations are unconditional.
- L2.3 Our remedies for your failure to pay on time or other defaults are set forth in the "Default and Remedies" section of the Pitney Bowes
- L2.4 You authorize us to file a Uniform Commercial Code financing statement naming you as debtor/lessee with respect to the Equipment

L8. EQUIPMENT OBLIGATIONS

- G5.1 <u>Default</u>. You are in immediate default if you do not make any payment when due, you breach any other obligation under this Agreement, you become insolvent or file for bankruptcy, or are in default under any agreement with PBI or PBGFS.
- G5.2 Remedies. Upon your default, we may:
 - (a) cancel this Agreement and any other agreements PBGFS or PBI has with you;
 - (b) require immediate payment of all payments due under a Lease(s) or other agreements, whether accrued or due in the future;
 - (c) disable the IntelliLink Control Center or Meter;
 - (d) require you to return the Equipment and IntelliLink Control Center or Meter;
 - (e) if you do not return the Equipment and IntelliLink Control Center or Meter, require you to make immediate payment of an amount equal to the remaining value of the Equipment, IntelliLink Control Center or Meter at the end of the Lease Term, as determined by us;
 - (f) charge you a late charge for each month that your payment is late;
 - (g) charge you interest on any late payment from its due date until paid in full at the lesser of 18% per year or the maximum rate allowed by law;
 - (h) charge you a check return fee for payments made by you with insufficient funds;
 - reasonably attempt to mitigate our damages and costs in the event of your default, although you acknowledge that we are not obligated to do so; and
 - (j) pursue any other remedy, including repossessing the Equipment without notice to you. By repossessing the Equipment, IntelliLink Control Center or Meter, we are not waiving our right to collect the balance due.
- G5.3 <u>Enforcing Our Rights.</u> You agree to pay all our costs, including attorneys' fees, in enforcing our rights under the Agreement with you.
- G5.4 <u>Suspension of Services</u>. PBI reserves the right to suspend any services during any period in which your account is more than thirty (30) days past due.

G6. TAXES

You agree to pay Pitney Bowes for all charges and taxes G6.1 (other than taxes on or measured by net income), calculated as set forth below, related to the Lease or based on or measured by the lease transaction, payments under the Lease, the Equipment or Equipment location, the Meter or Meter location or services provided in connection with the lease transaction, including but not limited to sales/use and property type taxes. Pitney Bowes will determine the value of the Equipment, the value of the Meter and the amount of such taxes to be charged to you. Such determinations will reflect a reasonable value of the Equipment or of the Meter or the actual taxes and depreciation thereon. The taxes and depreciation to be charged on the Equipment and the Meter may reflect certain average tax rates, different depreciation schedules or some other calculation. You agree to pay a processing, billing and tracking fee and administrative charge to be determined by Pitney Bowes which may not bear a relationship to the tax charged or services performed, but

such fee and charge shall in no event exceed in the aggregate \$35 for each year for each Lease schedule.

G7. EMBEDDED SOFTWARE

G7.1

Our Equipment may contain embedded software. You agree that: (i) PBI and its licensors own the copyrights and other intellectual property in and to the embedded software; (ii) you are licensed only to use the embedded software with our Equipment in which the embedded software resides; (iii) you will not copy, modify, de-compile, or otherwise attempt to unbundle, reverse engineer or create derivative works of the embedded software, except as permitted by applicable law; (iv) you will not distribute or otherwise disclose the embedded software (or any portion thereof) to any other person; and (v) you may not export the embedded software in contravention of applicable export control laws. The embedded software contains third party software, which, notwithstanding the above, is subject to any terms that may accompany such third party software.

G8. INTERNET ACCESS POINT

G8.1 The Connect+ Series Equipment may use an internet access point (e.g., wireless router) provided by us. You may only use this access point for connectivity between the Connect+ Series Equipment and the internet and for no other purpose. You agree to pay all costs associated with use of the access point in violation of this restriction.

G.9. MISCELLANEOUS

- G9.1 <u>Force Majeure</u>. We are not responsible for any delay or failure to perform resulting from causes beyond our control.
- G9.2 <u>Assignment.</u> You may not assign this Agreement without our prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any purported assignment is void.
- G9.3 No Right to Setoff. Payments are not subject to setoff or reduction.
- G9.4 Legal Action. ANY LEGAL ACTION YOU FILE AGAINST US MUST BE STARTED WITHIN ONE (1) YEAR AFTER THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO YOUR CLAIM. YOU WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT.
- G9.5 Merger; Amendment; Severability. The Agreement incorporates all of the terms agreed by both parties and can only be changed by written agreement. You may use a purchase order to offer to obtain Equipment or services but you agree that none of the provisions of your purchase order will add to, modify or supersede these provisions unless we expressly agree in writing. If one or more provisions of this Agreement are deemed to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not be affected.
- G9.6 Survival. Our respective rights and obligations under Section G4 (Limitation of Liability), G5 (Default and Remedies) and G6 (Taxes) survive termination of the Agreement.
- G9.7 Choice of Law. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Delaware without regard to its conflicts of laws principles.

SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT (SLA)

The following provisions describe the Service Level Agreement ("SLA") tiers that PBI offers on Covered Equipment (excluding software). The SLA tier you select will be listed on the Order. A separate Software License and Maintenance Agreement ("SMA") covers software maintenance and will be attached to the Order if you are acquiring software.

S1. DEFINITIONS

All capitalized terms that are not defined in these provisions are defined in the "Definitions" section of the General Terms.

S2. SERVICE LEVEL TIERS

The following describes the three SLA tiers offered by PBI for the Covered Equipment.

S2.1 Tier

(a) <u>General</u>. Under Tier 1, PBI will provide at its option either repair or replacement services for the Covered Equipment during the Initial Service Term or any Renewal Service Term (as defined in Section S4.2) (the "Maintenance Service Term"). You are also entitled to two preventative maintenance service calls per calendar year. PB will notify you when preventative maintenance is due or preventative maintenance service calls may be made at your initiation.

- (b) <u>Obtaining Service</u>. You can obtain service online or by telephone as set forth in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms.
- (c) Replacement Service.
 - If PBI determines that replacement is necessary, PBI will, at no additional cost, promptly ship new,

- reconditioned, or remanufactured equipment of the same or a functionally equivalent model to replace the affected Covered Equipment.
- (ii) Within five (5) days of receiving the replacement equipment, you must pack the Covered Equipment to be replaced in the shipping carton that contained the replacement equipment, place the pre-paid return address label on the carton, and return it to PBI.
- (iii) You are responsible for the return of Covered Equipment until PBI receives it.

(d) Repair Service.

- (i) If PBI determines that repair service is necessary, PBI may provide repair by remote access, diagnostics and coordinated remote service, or by on-site repair service.
- (ii) Repair service is provided only for damage resulting from normal wear and tear. Repair service may include the use of new, reconditioned, or remanufactured parts and assemblies.
- (iii) PBI will provide parts or assemblies for discontinued equipment (or equipment not marketed as new) only if available.
- (iv) If PBI deems it necessary, PBI will dispatch a service technician to arrive at your location for onsite service. You will not incur hourly charges unless service is performed outside Normal Working Hours, which will be done only with your consent.

S2.2 Tier 2

- (a) If you select Tier 2, we will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 1, PLUS:
 - (ii) Ongoing Equipment Training Services. PBI will provide the following training. PBI will schedule the training at a time convenient for you and PBI. Training will include an overview for the operator(s) on how to use the Covered Equipment. The number of training sessions that are included during each twelve (12) month period during the Maintenance Service Term are as follows:
 - Mail finishing products (which includes Meters and scales) - up to six (6) training sessions;
 - (2) Mail finishing accounting software solutions up to four (4) training sessions;
 - (3) Mail creation hardware products (which includes tabletop folders, tabletop inserters, and address printers) - up to four (4) training sessions; and
 - (4) Distribution solutions hardware products up to four (4) training sessions.
 - (iii) <u>Additional Covered Items</u>. PBI will provide printheads for Meters or Covered Equipment without additional charge.

S2.3 Tier 3

- (a) If you select Tier 3, PBI will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 1 and Tier 2, PLUS:
 - (ii) Preventive Maintenance Services.
 - (1) PBI will perform maintenance on the Covered Equipment at regular intervals.
 - (iii) Response Time Commitment.
 - (1) If PBI determines that on-site service is necessary, PBI will use commercially reasonable efforts to have a service technician on-site within four (4) hours (during Normal Working Hours only) of PBI's receipt of the call at the Customer Care Center (the "Response Time Commitment").
 - (2) The Response Time Commitment relates solely to the arrival of a technician at your location; it is not a guaranteed resolution of the problem within the four (4) hour time period, nor does it guarantee that

- all parts necessary to make a repair will be on-site within this time frame.
- (3) The Response Time Commitment does not apply to Service designated as service by replacement, software maintenance, preventive maintenance, operator training, or other services not essential to repair the Covered Equipment. These services will be scheduled in advance.
- (4) If the Covered Equipment is moved from its original location, PBI may remove the Response Time Commitment. If this happens, you will receive a refund equal to the difference between the cost of the Response Time Commitment and the cost of maintenance coverage without this obligation.
- (iv) <u>Liquidated Damages for Failure to Meet Response</u> Time.
 - (1) PBI agrees that if it does not meet the Response Time Commitment, PBI will provide you with a credit equal to six (6) months of the cost of the premium of the Response Time Commitment.
 - (2) You must use a credit request form in order to request a credit. You may obtain a credit form from your service technician or by calling the Customer Care Center. The credits are limited to credits for two (2) failures to meet the Response Time Commitment in any twelve (12) month period during the Maintenance Service Term. The remedies described in this Section are your sole remedy for PBI's failure to meet the Response Time Commitment.

S2.4 Connect+ Advantage

- If you select Connect+ Advantage, PBI will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 2 PLUS:
 - (ii) If you select Tier 3 in addition to Connect+ Advantage, coverage provided under Tier 3.
- (b) Connect+ Advantage is only available for items listed with a # next to the description.

S3. FEES

- S3.1 You will pay the fees for the Initial Service Term, and any Renewal Service Term(s). These fees are incorporated into your payment cycle (e.g., Quarterly Payment for leased equipment).
- S3.2 <u>Late Fees.</u> Our remedies for your failure to pay on time are set forth in the "Default; Remedies" section of the General
- S3.3 <u>Fees for Services Not Covered by this SLA</u>. If the service technician provides service for repairs caused by one of the conditions listed in Section S6.1(a)(ii), PBI will charge you for the service at PBI's current hourly rates and for any required parts.

S4. MAINTENANCE SERVICE

- S4.1 <u>Term.</u> PBI will provide you with Maintenance Service for the Initial Service Term and any Renewal Service Terms.
- S4.2 <u>RENEWAL SERVICE TEŔM(S)</u>. MAINTENANCE SERVICE AUTOMATICALLY RENEWS FOR CONSECUTIVE ONE (1) YEAR TERMS (EACH, A "RENEWAL SERVICE TERM"), UNLESS:
 - (a) YOU TERMINATE MAINTENANCE SERVICE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION S4.3 AT LEAST SIXTY (60) DAYS PRIOR TO THE RENEWAL OF THE TERM; OR
 - (b) YOUR LEASE EXPIRES OR IS TERMINATED (IN WHICH CASE, THE MAINTENANCE SERVICE TERM WILL TERMINATE ON THE SAME DAY AS THE LEASE); OR
 - (c) THE RENEWAL IS PROHIBITED BY APPLICABLE LAW.

S4.3 <u>Ending Your Maintenance Service</u>.

(a) If you do not wish to renew Maintenance Service, you must deliver a written notice (including your account number) (the "Termination Notice") by Certified Mail™ to the address listed in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms. Your Termination Notice must include your customer account number and lease

- number (if applicable), and is effective ten (10) business days after PBI receives it.
- (b) PBI reserves the right not to renew your SLA at any time and for any reason.

S4.4 Maintenance Service Changes.

- (a) PBI may modify its Maintenance Service by giving written notice to you (a "Maintenance Change Notice"), which will state whether the change is material.
- (b) After receiving a Maintenance Change Notice, if the change is material, you may terminate Maintenance Service as described in Section S4.3 above.

S5. WARRANTIES; LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

S5.1 The warranty for the Equipment and services as well as PBI's Limitation of Liability are set forth in the applicable section of the General Terms.

S6. ADDITIONAL MAINTENANCE TERMS

- S6.1 These terms apply to all Maintenance Service tiers:
 - (a) Limitations. Maintenance Service does not include:
 - (i) software maintenance and/or updates; and
 - (ii) services and repairs that are made necessary due to:
 - (A) negligence or accident, damage in transit,
 - virus contamination and loss of data;
 (B) use of Covered Equipment in a manner not
 - authorized by this SLA or the Equipment user guide;
 (C) natural causes such as fire or flood as well as
 - (C) natural causes such as fire or flood as well as other causes outside of PBI's control;
 - (D) use of Covered Equipment in an environment with unsuitable humidity and/or line voltage;
 - (E) loss of electrical power, power fluctuation, operator error;
 - (F) sabotage, repair or attempted repair by anyone other than PBI;

- (G) the use of third party supplies (such as ink), hardware, or software resulting in: (i) damage to the Equipment; (ii) poor indicia, text, or image print quality; (iii) indicia readability failures; or (iv) a failure to print indicia, text, or images;
- (H) failure to use applicable software updates; or
- use of Covered Equipment with any system for which PBI has advised it will no longer provide support or has advised is no longer compatible.
- (b) <u>Additional Exclusions</u>. Unless covered under one of the above maintenance tiers, Maintenance Service excludes the supply of rate program software for electronic scales and weighing systems, software maintenance and/or updates and consumable supplies for all levels of service, including printheads for Meters and IntelliLink Control Centers.

(c) Replacement Equipment.

- (i) If you replace any of your Covered Equipment during the Maintenance Service Term, and the replacement Equipment qualifies for maintenance services, PBI will automatically enroll you for maintenance coverage on the new Equipment at PBI's then current annual rates.
- (ii) If you acquire an attachment, or add a unit, to your Covered Equipment, PBI will provide coverage for any qualifying attachment or unit and adjust your rate accordingly.
- (iii) If you choose not to continue coverage on the replacement Equipment, attachment or unit, you may cancel Maintenance Service with respect to the item within thirty (30) days of the date of your initial invoice for the item from PBI. If you cancel, any further maintenance or repair services on the Equipment, attachment or unit will be subject to PBI's current rates.

EQUIPMENT AND POSTAGE METER RENTAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following provisions apply whenever you acquire an IntelliLink[®] Control Center or Meter from Pitney Bowes. Other terms may also apply, depending on the transaction.

R1. DEFINITIONS

All capitalized terms that are not defined in these provisions are defined in the "Definitions" section of the General Terms.

R2. EQUIPMENT RENTAL AND INTELLILINK® SUBSCRIPTION (METER RENTAL)

R2.1 <u>Fees</u>.

- a) If you are not leasing the Equipment and paying for it in your lease payment to PBGFS, we will invoice you the Equipment rental ("rental") and IntelliLink Subscription fees listed on the Order.
- (b) After the Initial Term, we may increase the rental and IntelliLink Subscription fees upon 30 days' prior written notice.
- (c) When you receive notice of an increase, you may terminate your rental only as of the date the increase becomes effective.

R2.2 Postage.

- (a) To obtain postage for your Meter, you must contact our Postage By Phone® data center.
- (b) You may transfer funds to the Bank for deposit into a Postage By Phone® Reserve Account that you maintain at the Bank ("your Reserve Account") or you may transfer funds to the United States Postal Service ("USPS") through a lockbox bank ("Lockbox Bank"). See the "USPS Acknowledgment of Deposit" section of the General Terms for more information.
- (c) After the Initial Term, we may increase postage refill fees upon 30 days prior written notice.
- (d) If you participate in any PBI, PBGFS, or Bank postage advance programs (such as Purchase Power®), we will advance payment on your behalf to the USPS, subject to repayment by you under the terms of the postage

advance program and billed separately from your IntelliLink Subscription fees.

R2.3 Meter Repair or Replacement.

(a) If the Meter malfunctions or fails due to reasons other than your negligence or accident, usage which exceeds our recommendations, damage in transit, virus contamination or loss of data, misuse, external forces, loss or fluctuation of power, fire, flood, or other natural causes, service by anyone other than us, or the use of third party supplies (such as third party ink) resulting in damage to the Meter, we will repair or replace the Meter.

R2.4 Terms of Use; Federal Regulations.

- (a) You may use the Meter solely for the purpose of processing your mail, provided that you are authorized by the USPS to use the Meter, and that you comply with (i) this Agreement, (ii) any user documentation and (iii) all USPS regulations.
- (b) You agree to use the Equipment and Meter only for business or commercial purposes, and not for personal, family, or household purposes.
- (c) You agree to use only attachments or printing devices authorized by us.
- (d) You must receive our written consent before moving the Equipment or Meter to a different location.
- (e) Federal regulations require that we own the Meter.
- (f) Tampering with or misusing the Meter is a violation of federal law.
- (g) Activities of the USPS including the payment of refunds for postage by the USPS to customers will be made in accordance with the current Domestic Mail Manual.
- (h) If the Meter is used in any unlawful scheme, or is not used for any consecutive 12 month period, or if you take

the Meter or allow the Meter to be taken outside the United States without proper written permission of USPS Headquarters, or if you otherwise fail to abide by the postal regulations and this Agreement regarding care and use of the Meter, then this Agreement and any related Meter rental may be revoked. You acknowledge that any use of this Meter that fraudulently deprives the USPS of revenue can cause you to be subject to civil and criminal penalties applicable to fraud and/or false claims against the United States. The submission of a false or fraudulent statement can result in imprisonment of up to 5 years and fines of up to \$10,000 (18 U.S.C. 1001) and a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 plus an assessment of twice the amount falsely claimed (3 U.S.C. 3802). The mailing of matter bearing a fraudulent postage meter imprint is an example of a violation of these statutes.

- (i) You are responsible for immediately reporting (within 72 hours or less) the theft or loss of the Meter to Us. Failure to comply with this notification provision in a timely manner may result in the denial of refund of any funds remaining on the Meter at the time of loss or theft.
- (j) You understand that the rules and regulations regarding the use of this Meter as documented in the Domestic Mail Manual may be updated from time to time by the USPS and it is your obligation to comply with any rules and regulations regarding its use.

R2.5 Rate Updates and Soft-Guard Program.

- (a) Your Meter or Equipment may require periodic rate information updates that you can obtain under our Soft-Guard program, or you will receive individual rate updates as a separate charge.
- (b) If you have purchased a Soft-Guard Subscription, we will provide up to 6 rate updates during each 12 month period following the date of installation of the Equipment.
- (c) We will provide rate updates only if required due to a postal or carrier change in rate, service, ZIP Code™ or zone change.
- (d) Your Soft-Guard Subscription does not cover any change in rates due to custom rate changes, new classes of carrier service, or a change in ZIP Code or zone due to Equipment relocation.
- (e) If your Soft-Guard Subscription has expired, or if you have received the maximum number of rate updates

under your Soft-Guard Subscription, you will be billed for any additional rate update you request.

(f) You can also renew the Soft-Guard Subscription by contacting PBI online or by telephone at the address and numbers set forth in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms.

R2.6 Warranty.

a) The warranty for the Equipment and services is set forth in the "Warranty" section of the General Terms.

R2.7 Limitation of Liability.

(a) PBI's limitation of liability is set forth in the "Limitation of Liability" section of the General Terms.

R2.8 Collection of Information.

- (a) You authorize us to access and download information from your Meter. We may disclose this information to the USPS or other authorized governmental entity.
- (b) We will not share with any third parties (except the USPS or other governmental entity) individually identifiable information that we obtain about you in this manner unless required to by law or court order.
- (c) We may elect to share aggregate data about our customers' postage usage with third parties.

R2.9 <u>IntelliLink® Control Center/Meter Care and Risk of Loss</u>

- (a) You agree to take proper care of the IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter(s) as stated in this Agreement and any user documentation.
- (b) You assume all risk of loss or damage to the IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter(s) while you have possession.

R3. VALUE BASED SERVICES

Value Based Services include services such as USPS[®] e-Return Receipt and USPS[®] Confirmation Services.

R3.1 *Fees*.

- (a) Any fees charged by the USPS for any Value Based Service you purchase are payable by you in the same way that you pay for postage.
- (b) The USPS is solely responsible for its services.
- (c) We are not responsible for any malfunctions of any part of the communication link connecting the IntelliLink Control Center with the USPS data system.
- R3.2 <u>Ending the Value Based Services</u>. We have the right to terminate the Value Based Services if the USPS discontinues offering the service or you breach your obligations under this Agreement and fail to cure the breach within thirty (30) days after you have been notified of it in writing.

UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF DEPOSIT

UI.1 In connection with your use of a Postage Evidencing System as defined in the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR"), you may transfer funds to the USPS through a lockbox bank (the "Lockbox Bank") for the purpose of prepayment of postage on Postage Evidencing Systems, generating evidence of postage, both PC Postage and meters (a "Deposit"), or you may transfer funds to the Bank for deposit into a Postage By Phone® Reserve Account ("your Reserve Account") which you maintain at the Bank.

UI.2 To the extent you deposit funds in advance of the use of any evidence of postage, you may, from time to time, make Deposits in the Lockbox Bank account identified as "United States Postal Service CMRS-PB" or make deposits in your Reserve Account, in either case through electronic means, including Automated Clearinghouse Transfers. The USPS may, at its discretion, designate itself or a successor as recipient of Deposits made by you to the Lockbox Bank account described above.

UI.3 Any deposit made by you in your Reserve Account is subject to the Postage By Phone® Reserve Account – Agreement and Disclosure Statement governing your Reserve Account.

UI.4 Any Deposit made by you in the Lockbox Bank account shall be credited by the USPS only for the payment of evidence of postage. Such Deposits may be commingled with Deposits of other customers. You shall not receive or be entitled to any interest or other income earned on such Deposits.

UI.5 The USPS will provide a refund to you for the remaining account balances of Deposits held by the USPS. These refunds are provided in accordance with the rules and regulations governing deposit of funds for evidence of postage, published in the CFR.

UI.6 The Lockbox Bank, which shall collect funds on behalf of the USPS, shall provide PBI, on each business day, information as to the amount of each Deposit made to the USPS by you, so that PBI can update its records.

UI.7 PBI may deposit funds on your behalf. The USPS will make no advances of funds to you. Any relationship concerning advances of funds is between you and PBI, PBGFS and/or the Bank.

UI.8 You acknowledge that the terms of this Acknowledgement may be changed, modified, or revoked by the USPS, with appropriate notice.

UI.9 Postal Regulations governing the deposit of funds are published in the CFR or its successor. You acknowledge that you shall be subject to all applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the USPS, including future changes to such rules, regulations, and orders, and such additional terms and conditions as may be determined in accordance with applicable law. The USPS rules, regulations, and orders shall prevail in the event of any conflict with any other terms and conditions applicable to any Deposit.

The following provisions apply when you first enroll in the Purchase Power Program (the "Program"). Additionally, you will receive from us a set of more specific provisions within twenty (20) days of the date of this Agreement that will be more specifically tailored to your Purchase Power Account (the "Account") and will apply to your ongoing participation in the Program.

- P1.1 <u>General.</u> (a) In order to participate in the Program, you must provide the information described in Section P1.8. (b) If you subscribe to the EasyPermitPostage® service, you may use the Purchase Power credit line to pay for permit postage and associated USPS fees.
- (c) The Purchase Power credit line is a product of The Pitney Bowes Bank, Inc. (the "Bank") and is not available to individuals for personal, family, or household purposes.
- P1.2 <u>Account Charges</u>. (a) Your Purchase Power Account (the "Account") will be charged for the amount of postage, products, and services requested and the related fees, if applicable.(b) Unless prohibited by law, you agree to pay the fees and charges of which the Bank has given you notice, including, without limitation, the fees and charges relating to: (i) transaction fees, if applicable; (ii) your failure to pay in a timely manner; (iii) your exceeding your credit line; and (iv) fees attributable to the return of any checks that you give to the Bank as payment of the Account.
- P1.3 <u>Billing, Payments, and Collection</u>. (a) You will receive a billing statement for each billing cycle in which you have activity on the Account. The Bank reserves the right to deliver any statement electronically to the email address that is then on file for the Company. (b) Payments are due by the due date shown on your billing statement.
- (c) You may pay the entire balance due or a portion of the balance, provided that you pay at least the minimum payment shown on the statement. In the event of a partial payment, you will be responsible for the unpaid balance.
- P1.4 <u>Deferred Payment Terms</u>. (a) By using the Program, you agree that whenever there is an unpaid balance outstanding on the Account which is not paid in full by the due date shown on your billing statement, the Bank will charge you, and you will pay, interest on the unpaid balance of the Account from time to time, for each day from the date the transaction is posted to the Account until the date the unpaid balance is paid in full, at a variable rate equal to the Annual Percentage Rate applicable to the Account from time to time. (b) (i) The Annual Percentage Rate applicable to the Account will be: the greater of (a) 22% and (b) the sum of the highest "Prime Rate" published in the "Money Rates" section of *The Wall Street Journal* on the last business day of the month and the margin set forth below (the sum of the margin and the Prime Rate is herein called the "Floating Rate"). We will deliver the mail to the USPS for final delivery. We will perform this service under this Agreement in accordance with accepted mail processing industry standards. EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED HEREIN, WE MAKE NO OTHER WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED.

X2. CUSTOMER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- X2.1 Letters. As of the date of this Agreement: for Letters, you will meter your Program Mail at the USPS rates set forth in the Additional Terms and Conditions. NO REPRESENTATION IS MADE AS TO THE AMOUNT OF YOUR MAIL THAT WILL QUALIFY FOR PRESORT MAILING RATES, AND YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR METERING YOUR PROGRAM MAIL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT REGARDLESS OF THE AMOUNT OF YOUR PROGRAM MAIL THAT QUALIFIES OR DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR PRESORT RATES. YOU HEREBY ASSIGN ANY AND ALL OF YOUR RIGHTS TO RECEIVE ANY POSTAGE REFUNDS OR REBATES BASED ON THE AMOUNT OF YOUR MAIL THAT QUALIFIES FOR ANY ADDITIONAL PRESORT MAILING RATES TO PBI (OR ITS SUBSIDIARIES) AND ALL SUCH REFUNDS OR REBATES WILL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF AND BE RETAINED BY PBI (OR ITS SUBSIDIARIES).
- X2.2 Flats. You will prepare and process your Flats as described in the Additional Terms and Conditions. You are responsible for metering all Flats that meet the criteria detailed in the Additional Terms

and Conditions at the current USPS 3 digit First-Class flat rate. You agree that we will invoice you through your Purchase Power Credit Line at the rate set forth in the Additional Terms and Conditions. We will bill you for the difference between the USPS regular flat rate and the 3 digit USPS First-Class flat rate for any Flats that do not comply with the requirements outlined in the Additional Terms and Conditions.

X2.3 <u>General</u>. You will have your Program Mail ready for pickup at your designated locations and in accordance with the schedule we mutually agree upon from time to time. You agree that time is of the essence with respect to each of your obligations for which time is a factor. You will ensure that your Program Mail complies with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to, all USPS regulations, and you will promptly execute any and all documents required by the USPS. You will ensure that your mail comp

lies with the requirements set forth in the Additional Terms and Conditions.

X3. GENERAL TERMS

- X3.1 <u>Indemnification</u>. In the event that we are subjected to any loss, expense, damage or liability due to your acts or omissions, including but not limited to any claims by any third parties, or fines or assessments imposed by the USPS or other governmental entities, you will indemnify and hold us harmless from such loss, expense, damage or liability, including our reasonable attorney's fees.

L1. DEFINITIONS

L1.1 All capitalized terms that are not defined in this document are defined in the "Definitions" section of the Pitney Bowes Terms.

- L2.1 You will make each Monthly Payment by the due date shown on our invoice.
- L2.2 You may not cancel this Agreement for any reason except as expressly set forth in Section L10 below. All payment obligations are unconditional.
- L2.3 Our remedies for your failure to pay on time or other defaults are set forth in the "Default and Remedies" section of the Pitney Bowes Terms.
- L2.4 You authorize us to file a Uniform Commercial Code financing statement naming you as debtor/lessee with respect to the Equipment.

L3. PAYMENT TERMS AND OBLIGATIONS

- L3.1 We will invoice you in arrears each month for all payments on the Order (each, a "Monthly Payment"), except as provided in any SOW attached to this Agreement.
- L3.2 Your Monthly Payment may include a one-time origination fee, amounts carried over from a previous unexpired lease, and other costs.

L8. EQUIPMENT OBLIGATIONS

- L8.1 Condition and Repairs. You will keep the Equipment free from liens and encumbrances and in good repair, condition, and working order.

G3. WARRANTY

The taxes and depreciation to be charged on the Equipment and the Meter may reflect certain average tax rates, different depreciation schedules or some other calculation. You agree to pay a processing, billing and tracking fee and administrative charge to be determined by Pitney Bowes which may not bear a relationship to the tax charged or services performed, but

such fee and charge shall in no event exceed in the aggregate \$35 for each year for each Lease schedule.

G7. EMBEDDED SOFTWARE

G7.1

Our Equipment may contain embedded software. You agree that: (i) PBI and its licensors own the copyrights and other intellectual property in and to the embedded software; (ii) you are licensed only to use the embedded software with our Equipment in which the embedded software resides; (iii) you will not copy, modify, de-compile, or otherwise attempt to unbundle, reverse engineer or create derivative works of the embedded software, except as permitted by applicable law; (iv) you will not distribute or otherwise disclose the embedded software (or any portion thereof) to any other person; and (v) you may not export the embedded software in contravention of applicable export control laws. The embedded software contains third party software, which, notwithstanding the above, is subject to any terms that may accompany such third party software.

G8. INTERNET ACCESS POINT

G8.1 The Connect+ Series Equipment may use an internet access point (e.g., wireless router) provided by us. You may only use this access point for connectivity between the Connect+ Series Equipment and the internet and for no other purpose. You agree to pay all costs associated with use of the access point in violation of this restriction.

G.9. MISCELLANEOUS

- G9.1 <u>Force Majeure.</u> We are not responsible for any delay or failure to perform resulting from causes beyond our control.
- G9.2 <u>Assignment.</u> You may not assign this Agreement without our prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. Any purported assignment is void.
- G9.3 No Right to Setoff. Payments are not subject to setoff or reduction.
- G9.4 Legal Action. ANY LEGAL ACTION YOU FILE AGAINST US MUST BE STARTED WITHIN ONE (1) YEAR AFTER THE EVENT GIVING RISE TO YOUR CLAIM. YOU WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT.
- G9.5 Merger; Amendment; Severability. The Agreement incorporates all of the terms agreed by both parties and can only be changed by written agreement. You may use a purchase order to offer to obtain Equipment or services but you agree that none of the provisions of your purchase order will add to, modify or supersede these provisions unless we expressly agree in writing. If one or more provisions of this Agreement are deemed to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will not be affected.
- G9.6 <u>Survival</u>. Our respective rights and obligations under Section G4 (Limitation of Liability), G5 (Default and Remedies) and G6 (Taxes) survive termination of the Agreement.
- G9.7 Choice of Law. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Delaware without regard to its conflicts of laws principles.

SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT (SLA)

The following provisions describe the Service Level Agreement ("SLA") tiers that PBI offers on Covered Equipment (excluding software). The SLA tier you select will be listed on the Order. A separate Software License and Maintenance Agreement ("SMA") covers software maintenance and will be attached to the Order if you are acquiring software.

S1. DEFINITIONS

All capitalized terms that are not defined in these provisions are defined in the "Definitions" section of the General Terms.

S2. SERVICE LEVEL TIERS

The following describes the three SLA tiers offered by PBI for the Covered Equipment.

S2.1 Tier 1

(a) <u>General</u>. Under Tier 1, PBI will provide at its option either repair or replacement services for the Covered Equipment during the Initial Service Term or any Renewal Service Term (as defined in Section S4.2) (the

- "Maintenance Service Term"). You are also entitled to two preventative maintenance service calls per calendar year. PB will notify you when preventative maintenance is due or preventative maintenance service calls may be made at your initiation.
- b) <u>Obtaining Service</u>. You can obtain service online or by telephone as set forth in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms.
- (c) Replacement Service.
 - If PBI determines that replacement is necessary, PBI will, at no additional cost, promptly ship new, reconditioned, or remanufactured equipment of the

- same or a functionally equivalent model to replace the affected Covered Equipment.
- (ii) Within five (5) days of receiving the replacement equipment, you must pack the Covered Equipment to be replaced in the shipping carton that contained the replacement equipment, place the pre-paid return address label on the carton, and return it to PBI.
- (iii) You are responsible for the return of Covered Equipment until PBI receives it.

(d) Repair Service.

- If PBI determines that repair service is necessary, PBI may provide repair by remote access, diagnostics and coordinated remote service, or by on-site repair service.
- (ii) Repair service is provided only for damage resulting from normal wear and tear. Repair service may include the use of new, reconditioned, or remanufactured parts and assemblies.
- (iii) PBI will provide parts or assemblies for discontinued equipment (or equipment not marketed as new) only if available.
- (iv) If PBI deems it necessary, PBI will dispatch a service technician to arrive at your location for onsite service. You will not incur hourly charges unless service is performed outside Normal Working Hours, which will be done only with your consent.

S2.2 Tier 2

- (a) If you select Tier 2, we will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 1, PLUS:
 - (iii) Ongoing Equipment Training Services. PBI will provide the following training. PBI will schedule the training at a time convenient for you and PBI. Training will include an overview for the operator(s) on how to use the Covered Equipment. The number of training sessions that are included during each twelve (12) month period during the Maintenance Service Term are as follows:
 - Mail finishing products (which includes Meters and scales) - up to six (6) training sessions;
 - (2) Mail finishing accounting software solutions up to four (4) training sessions;
 - (3) Mail creation hardware products (which includes tabletop folders, tabletop inserters, and address printers) - up to four (4) training sessions; and
 - (4) Distribution solutions hardware products up to four (4) training sessions.
 - (iii) <u>Additional Covered Items.</u> PBI will provide printheads for Meters or Covered Equipment without additional charge.

S2.3 Tier 3

- (a) If you select Tier 3, PBI will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 1 and Tier 2, PLUS:
 - (ii) Preventive Maintenance Services.
 - (1) PBI will perform maintenance on the Covered Equipment at regular intervals.
 - (iii) Response Time Commitment.
 - (1) If PBI determines that on-site service is necessary, PBI will use commercially reasonable efforts to have a service technician on-site within four (4) hours (during Normal Working Hours only) of PBI's receipt of the call at the Customer Care Center (the "Response Time Commitment").
 - (2) The Response Time Commitment relates solely to the arrival of a technician at your location; it is not a guaranteed resolution of the problem within the four (4) hour time period, nor does it guarantee that all parts necessary to make a repair will be on-site within this time frame.

- (3) The Response Time Commitment does not apply to Service designated as service by replacement, software maintenance, preventive maintenance, operator training, or other services not essential to repair the Covered Equipment. These services will be scheduled in advance.
- (4) If the Covered Equipment is moved from its original location, PBI may remove the Response Time Commitment. If this happens, you will receive a refund equal to the difference between the cost of the Response Time Commitment and the cost of maintenance coverage without this obligation.

(iv) <u>Liquidated Damages for Failure to Meet Response Time.</u>

- (1) PBI agrees that if it does not meet the Response Time Commitment, PBI will provide you with a credit equal to six (6) months of the cost of the premium of the Response Time Commitment.
- (2) You must use a credit request form in order to request a credit. You may obtain a credit form from your service technician or by calling the Customer Care Center. The credits are limited to credits for two (2) failures to meet the Response Time Commitment in any twelve (12) month period during the Maintenance Service Term. The remedies described in this Section are your sole remedy for PBI's failure to meet the Response Time Commitment.

S2.4 Connect+ Advantage

- (a) If you select Connect+ Advantage, PBI will provide the following support:
 - (i) All coverage provided under Tier 2 PLUS:
 - (ii) If you select Tier 3 in addition to Connect+ Advantage, coverage provided under Tier 3.
- (b) Connect+ Advantage is only available for items listed with a # next to the description.

S3. FEES

- S3.1 You will pay the fees for the Initial Service Term, and any Renewal Service Term(s). These fees are incorporated into your payment cycle (e.g., Quarterly Payment for leased equipment).
- S3.2 <u>Late Fees.</u> Our remedies for your failure to pay on time are set forth in the "Default; Remedies" section of the General Terms.
- S3.3 Fees for Services Not Covered by this SLA. If the service technician provides service for repairs caused by one of the conditions listed in Section S6.1(a)(ii), PBI will charge you for the service at PBI's current hourly rates and for any required parts.

S4. MAINTENANCE SERVICE

- S4.1 <u>Term.</u> PBI will provide you with Maintenance Service for the Initial Service Term and any Renewal Service Terms.
- S4.2 RENEWAL SERVICE TERM(S). MAINTENANCE SERVICE AUTOMATICALLY RENEWS FOR CONSECUTIVE ONE (1) YEAR TERMS (EACH, A "RENEWAL SERVICE TERM"), UNLESS:
 - (a) YOU TERMINATE MAINTENANCE SERVICE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION S4.3 AT LEAST SIXTY (60) DAYS PRIOR TO THE RENEWAL OF THE TERM; OR
 - (b) YOUR LEASE EXPIRES OR IS TERMINATED (IN WHICH CASE, THE MAINTENANCE SERVICE TERM WILL TERMINATE ON THE SAME DAY AS THE LEASE); OR
 - (c) THE RENEWAL IS PROHIBITED BY APPLICABLE LAW.

S4.3 <u>Ending Your Maintenance Service</u>.

(a) If you do not wish to renew Maintenance Service, you must deliver a written notice (including your account number) (the "Termination Notice") by Certified Mail™ to the address listed in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms. Your Termination Notice must include your customer account number and lease number (if applicable), and is effective ten (10) business days after PBI receives it.

- (b) PBI reserves the right not to renew your SLA at any time and for any reason.
- S4.4 Maintenance Service Changes.
 - (a) PBI may modify its Maintenance Service by giving written notice to you (a "Maintenance Change Notice"), which will state whether the change is material.
 - (b) After receiving a Maintenance Change Notice, if the change is material, you may terminate Maintenance Service as described in Section S4.3 above.

S5. WARRANTIES; LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

S5.1 The warranty for the Equipment and services as well as PBI's Limitation of Liability are set forth in the applicable section of the General Terms.

S6. ADDITIONAL MAINTENANCE TERMS

- S6.1 These terms apply to all Maintenance Service tiers:
 - (a) Limitations. Maintenance Service does not include:
 - (i) software maintenance and/or updates; and
 - (ii) services and repairs that are made necessary due to:
 - (A) negligence or accident, damage in transit, virus contamination and loss of data;
 - (B) use of Covered Equipment in a manner not authorized by this SLA or the Equipment user quide:
 - (C) natural causes such as fire or flood as well as other causes outside of PBI's control;
 - (D) use of Covered Equipment in an environment with unsuitable humidity and/or line voltage;
 - (E) loss of electrical power, power fluctuation, operator error;
 - (F) sabotage, repair or attempted repair by anyone other than PBI;

- (G) the use of third party supplies (such as ink), hardware, or software resulting in: (i) damage to the Equipment; (ii) poor indicia, text, or image print quality; (iii) indicia readability failures; or (iv) a failure to print indicia, text, or images;
- (H) failure to use applicable software updates; or
- use of Covered Equipment with any system for which PBI has advised it will no longer provide support or has advised is no longer compatible.
- (b) <u>Additional Exclusions</u>. Unless covered under one of the above maintenance tiers, Maintenance Service excludes the supply of rate program software for electronic scales and weighing systems, software maintenance and/or updates and consumable supplies for all levels of service, including printheads for Meters and IntelliLink Control Centers.
- (c) Replacement Equipment.
 - (i) If you replace any of your Covered Equipment during the Maintenance Service Term, and the replacement Equipment qualifies for maintenance services, PBI will automatically enroll you for maintenance coverage on the new Equipment at PBI's then current annual rates.
 - (ii) If you acquire an attachment, or add a unit, to your Covered Equipment, PBI will provide coverage for any qualifying attachment or unit and adjust your rate accordingly.
 - (iii) If you choose not to continue coverage on the replacement Equipment, attachment or unit, you may cancel Maintenance Service with respect to the item within thirty (30) days of the date of your initial invoice for the item from PBI. If you cancel, any further maintenance or repair services on the Equipment, attachment or unit will be subject to PBI's current rates.

EQUIPMENT AND POSTAGE METER RENTAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following provisions apply whenever you acquire an IntelliLink[®] Control Center or Meter from Pitney Bowes. Other terms may also apply, depending on the transaction.

R1. DEFINITIONS

All capitalized terms that are not defined in these provisions are defined in the "Definitions" section of the General Terms.

R2. EQUIPMENT RENTAL AND INTELLILINK® SUBSCRIPTION (METER RENTAL)

- R2.1 Fees.
 - (a) If you are not leasing the Equipment and paying for it in your lease payment to PBGFS, we will invoice you the Equipment rental ("rental") and IntelliLink Subscription fees listed on the Order.
 - (b) After the Initial Term, we may increase the rental and IntelliLink Subscription fees upon 30 days' prior written notice.
 - (c) When you receive notice of an increase, you may terminate your rental only as of the date the increase becomes effective.

R2.2 Postage.

- (a) To obtain postage for your Meter, you must contact our Postage By Phone[®] data center.
- (b) You may transfer funds to the Bank for deposit into a Postage By Phone® Reserve Account that you maintain at the Bank ("your Reserve Account") or you may transfer funds to the United States Postal Service ("USPS") through a lockbox bank ("Lockbox Bank"). See the "USPS Acknowledgment of Deposit" section of the General Terms for more information.
- (c) After the Initial Term, we may increase postage refill fees upon 30 days prior written notice.
- (d) If you participate in any PBI, PBGFS, or Bank postage advance programs (such as Purchase Power[®]), we will advance payment on your behalf to the USPS, subject to repayment by you under the terms of the postage advance program and billed separately from your IntelliLink Subscription fees.
- R2.3 <u>Meter Repair or Replacement.</u>

- (a) If the Meter malfunctions or fails due to reasons other than your negligence or accident, usage which exceeds our recommendations, damage in transit, virus contamination or loss of data, misuse, external forces, loss or fluctuation of power, fire, flood, or other natural causes, service by anyone other than us, or the use of third party supplies (such as third party ink) resulting in damage to the Meter, we will repair or replace the Meter.
- R2.4 <u>Terms of Use; Federal Regulations</u>.
 - (a) You may use the Meter solely for the purpose of processing your mail, provided that you are authorized by the USPS to use the Meter, and that you comply with (i) this Agreement, (ii) any user documentation and (iii) all USPS regulations.
 - (b) You agree to use the Equipment and Meter only for business or commercial purposes, and not for personal, family, or household purposes.
 - (c) You agree to use only attachments or printing devices authorized by us.
 - (d) You must receive our written consent before moving the Equipment or Meter to a different location.
 - (e) Federal regulations require that we own the Meter.
 - (f) Tampering with or misusing the Meter is a violation of federal law.
 - (g) Activities of the USPS including the payment of refunds for postage by the USPS to customers will be made in accordance with the current Domestic Mail Manual.
 - (h) If the Meter is used in any unlawful scheme, or is not used for any consecutive 12 month period, or if you take the Meter or allow the Meter to be taken outside the United States without proper written permission of USPS Headquarters, or if you otherwise fail to abide by the postal regulations and this Agreement regarding care and use of the Meter, then this Agreement and any related Meter rental may be revoked. You acknowledge

that any use of this Meter that fraudulently deprives the USPS of revenue can cause you to be subject to civil and criminal penalties applicable to fraud and/or false claims against the United States. The submission of a false or fraudulent statement can result in imprisonment of up to 5 years and fines of up to \$10,000 (18 U.S.C. 1001) and a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 plus an assessment of twice the amount falsely claimed (3 U.S.C. 3802). The mailing of matter bearing a fraudulent postage meter imprint is an example of a violation of these statutes.

- (i) You are responsible for immediately reporting (within 72 hours or less) the theft or loss of the Meter to Us. Failure to comply with this notification provision in a timely manner may result in the denial of refund of any funds remaining on the Meter at the time of loss or theft.
- (j) You understand that the rules and regulations regarding the use of this Meter as documented in the Domestic Mail Manual may be updated from time to time by the USPS and it is your obligation to comply with any rules and regulations regarding its use.

R2.5 Rate Updates and Soft-Guard Program.

- (a) Your Meter or Equipment may require periodic rate information updates that you can obtain under our Soft-Guard program, or you will receive individual rate updates as a separate charge.
- (b) If you have purchased a Soft-Guard Subscription, we will provide up to 6 rate updates during each 12 month period following the date of installation of the Equipment.
- (c) We will provide rate updates only if required due to a postal or carrier change in rate, service, ZIP Code™ or zone change.
- (d) Your Soft-Guard Subscription does not cover any change in rates due to custom rate changes, new classes of carrier service, or a change in ZIP Code or zone due to Equipment relocation.
- (e) If your Soft-Guard Subscription has expired, or if you have received the maximum number of rate updates under your Soft-Guard Subscription, you will be billed for any additional rate update you request.
- (f) You can also renew the Soft-Guard Subscription by contacting PBI online or by telephone at the address

and numbers set forth in the "How to Contact Us" section of the General Terms.

<u>Warranty</u>.

(a) The warranty for the Equipment and services is set forth in the "Warranty" section of the General Terms.

R2.7 <u>Limitation of Liability</u>.

R2.6

(a) PBI's limitation of liability is set forth in the "Limitation of Liability" section of the General Terms.

R2.8 Collection of Information.

- (a) You authorize us to access and download information from your Meter. We may disclose this information to the USPS or other authorized governmental entity.
- (b) We will not share with any third parties (except the USPS or other governmental entity) individually identifiable information that we obtain about you in this manner unless required to by law or court order.
- (c) We may elect to share aggregate data about our customers' postage usage with third parties.

R2.9 IntelliLink® Control Center/Meter Care and Risk of Loss

- (a) You agree to take proper care of the IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter(s) as stated in this Agreement and any user documentation.
- (b) You assume all risk of loss or damage to the IntelliLink Control Center and/or Meter(s) while you have possession.

R3. VALUE BASED SERVICES

Value Based Services include services such as $USPS^{\otimes}$ e-Return Receipt and $USPS^{\otimes}$ Confirmation Services.

R3.1 *Fee*

- (a) Any fees charged by the USPS for any Value Based Service you purchase are payable by you in the same way that you pay for postage.
- (b) The USPS is solely responsible for its services.
- (c) We are not responsible for any malfunctions of any part of the communication link connecting the IntelliLink Control Center with the USPS data system.
- R3.2 <u>Ending the Value Based Services</u>. We have the right to terminate the Value Based Services if the USPS discontinues offering the service or you breach your obligations under this Agreement and fail to cure the breach within thirty (30) days after you have been notified of it in writing.

UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF DEPOSIT

UI.1 In connection with your use of a Postage Evidencing System as defined in the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR"), you may transfer funds to the USPS through a lockbox bank (the "Lockbox Bank") for the purpose of prepayment of postage on Postage Evidencing Systems, generating evidence of postage, both PC Postage and meters (a "Deposit"), or you may transfer funds to the Bank for deposit into a Postage By Phone® Reserve Account ("your Reserve Account") which you maintain at the Bank.

UI.2 To the extent you deposit funds in advance of the use of any evidence of postage, you may, from time to time, make Deposits in the Lockbox Bank account identified as "United States Postal Service CMRS-PB" or make deposits in your Reserve Account, in either case through electronic means, including Automated Clearinghouse Transfers. The USPS may, at its discretion, designate itself or a successor as recipient of Deposits made by you to the Lockbox Bank account described above.

UI.3 Any deposit made by you in your Reserve Account is subject to the Postage By Phone® Reserve Account – Agreement and Disclosure Statement governing your Reserve Account.

UI.4 Any Deposit made by you in the Lockbox Bank account shall be credited by the USPS only for the payment of evidence of postage. Such Deposits may be commingled with Deposits of other customers. You shall not receive or be entitled to any interest or other income earned on such Deposits.

UI.5 The USPS will provide a refund to you for the remaining account balances of Deposits held by the USPS. These refunds are provided in accordance with the rules and regulations governing deposit of funds for evidence of postage, published in the CFR.

UI.6 The Lockbox Bank, which shall collect funds on behalf of the USPS, shall provide PBI, on each business day, information as to the amount of each Deposit made to the USPS by you, so that PBI can update its records.

UI.7 PBI may deposit funds on your behalf. The USPS will make no advances of funds to you. Any relationship concerning advances of funds is between you and PBI, PBGFS and/or the Bank.

UI.8 You acknowledge that the terms of this Acknowledgement may be changed, modified, or revoked by the USPS, with appropriate notice.

UI.9 Postal Regulations governing the deposit of funds are published in the CFR or its successor. You acknowledge that you shall be subject to all applicable rules, regulations, and orders of the USPS, including future changes to such rules, regulations, and orders, and such additional terms and conditions as may be determined in accordance with applicable law. The USPS rules, regulations, and orders shall prevail in the event of any conflict with any other terms and conditions applicable to any Deposit.

PURCHASE POWER® TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following provisions apply when you first enroll in the Purchase Power Program (the "Program"). Additionally, you will receive from us a set of more specific provisions within twenty (20) days of the date of this Agreement that will be more specifically tailored to your Purchase Power Account (the "Account") and will apply to your ongoing participation in the Program.

- P1.1 <u>General</u>. (a) In order to participate in the Program, you must provide the information described in Section P1.8. (b) If you subscribe to the EasyPermitPostage® service, you may use the Purchase Power credit line to pay for permit postage and associated USPS fees.
- (c) The Purchase Power credit line is a product of The Pitney Bowes Bank, Inc. (the "Bank") and is not available to individuals for personal, family, or household purposes.
- P1.2 <u>Account Charges</u>. (a) Your Purchase Power Account (the "Account") will be charged for the amount of postage, products, and services requested and the related fees, if applicable.(b) Unless prohibited by law, you agree to pay the fees and charges of which the Bank has given you notice, including, without limitation, the fees and charges relating to: (i) transaction fees, if applicable; (ii) your failure to pay in a timely manner; (iii) your exceeding your credit line; and (iv) fees attributable to the return of any checks that you give to the Bank as payment of the Account.
- P1.3 <u>Billing, Payments, and Collection</u>. (a) You will receive a billing statement for each billing cycle in which you have activity on the Account. The Bank reserves the right to deliver any statement electronically to the email address that is then on file for the Company. (b) Payments are due by the due date shown on your billing statement.
- (c) You may pay the entire balance due or a portion of the balance, provided that you pay at least the minimum payment shown on the statement. In the event of a partial payment, you will be responsible for the unpaid balance.
- P1.4 <u>Deferred Payment Terms</u>. (a) By using the Program, you agree that whenever there is an unpaid balance outstanding on the Account which is not paid in full by the due date shown on your billing statement, the Bank will charge you, and you will pay, interest on the unpaid balance of the Account from time to time, for each day from the date the transaction is posted to the Account until the date the unpaid balance is paid in full, at a variable rate equal to the Annual Percentage Rate applicable to the Account from time to time. (b) (i) The Annual Percentage Rate applicable to the Account will be: the greater of (a) 22% and (b) the sum of the highest "Prime Rate" published in the "Money Rates" section of *The Wall Street Journal* on the last business day of the month and the margin set forth below (the sum of the margin and the Prime Rate is herein called the "Floating Rate"). (ii) The Annual Percentage Rate will be adjusted on a monthly basis based on any fluctuation in the Floating Rate, if applicable.
- (iii) Any change in the Annual Percentage Rate based on the calculation described in this section will become effective on the first

- day of your next billing cycle. (iv) The margin which will be added to the Prime Rate to determine the Floating Rate will be 14.75% (using the Prime Rate in effect as of March 31, 2010, the daily periodic rate would be .049315% and the corresponding annual percentage rate would be 18.00%). (v) The Account balance that is subject to a finance charge each day will include (a) outstanding balances, minus any payments and credits received by the Bank on the Account that day, and (b) unpaid interest, fees, and other charges on the Account. (vi) The Bank will charge a minimum finance charge of \$1.00 in any billing cycle if the finance charge as calculated above is less than \$1.00. (vii) Each payment that you make will be applied to reduce the outstanding balance of the Account and replenish your available credit line. (viii) The Bank may refuse to extend further credit if the amount of a requested charge plus your existing balance exceeds your credit.

 - <u>1.27.1</u> NJPA is seeking a Contract base term of four years subject to annual renewals as allowed by Minnesota Contracting Law. Full term is expected, however will only occur through successful annual renewals. One additional one-year renewal-extension may be offered by NJPA to Vendor beyond the original four year term if NJPA deems such action to be in the best interests of NJPA and its Members.
- **1.28 Minimum Contract Value:** NJPA anticipates considerable activity resulting from this RFP and subsequent award; however no commitment of any kind is made concerning actual quantities to be acquired. NJPA does not guarantee usage. Usage will depend on the actual needs of the NJPA Members

and the value of the awarded contract.

- **1.29** Estimated Contract Volume: Estimated quantities and sales volume are based on potential usage by NJPA and NJPA Member agencies nationally.
- 1.30 Largest Possible Solution: If applicable, Contracts will be awarded to Proposer(s) able to deliver a proposal meeting the entire needs of NJPA and its Members within the scope of this RFP. NJPA prefers Proposers submit their complete product line of products and services described in the scope of this RFP. NJPA reserves the right to reject individual, or groupings of specific equipment/products and services proposals as a part of the award.
- <u>1.31</u> Contract Availability: This Contract must be available to all current and potential NJPA Members who choose to utilize this NJPA Contract to include all governmental agencies, public and private primary and secondary education agencies, and all non-profit organizations nationally.
- **1.32 Proposer's Commitment Period**: In order to allow NJPA the opportunity to evaluate each proposal thoroughly, NJPA requires any response to this solicitation be valid and irrevocable for ninety (90) days after the date proposals were opened regarding this RFP.

F. EXPECTATIONS FOR EQUIPMENT/PRODUCTS AND SERVICES BEING PROPOSED

- 1.33 Industry Standards: Except as contained herein, the specifications or solutions for this RFP shall be those accepted guidelines set forth by the POSTAGE METERS AND RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE, ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES industry, as they are generally understood and accepted within that industry across the nation. Submitted products/services, related services, and their warranties and assurances are required to meet and/or exceed all current, traditional and anticipated needs and requirements of NJPA and its Members.
 - <u>1.33.1</u> **Deviations from industry standards** must be identified by the Proposer and explained how, in their opinion, the equipment/products and servicesthey propose will render equivalent functionality, coverage, performance, and/or service. Failure to detail all such deviations may comprise sufficient grounds for rejection of the entire proposal.
 - **1.33.2 Technical Descriptions/Specifications.** Bidder's must supply **sufficient** information to:
 - Demonstrate the Bidder's knowledge of industry standards, and
 - identify the products and services being bid, and
 - differentiate those products and services from others.

Excessive technical descriptions and specifications which, in the opinion of NJPA, unduly enlarges the bid response may reduce evaluation points awarded on Form G.

- **1.34 Important note:** NJPA does not typically offer specific product and service specifications; rather NJPA is requesting an industry standard or accepted specification for the requested products and services. Where specific line items are specified, those line items should be considered the minimum which can be expanded by the Proposer to deliver the Proposer's "Solution" to NJPA and NJPA Member's needs.
- <u>1.35</u> Commonly used Goods and Services: It is important that the equipment/products and services submitted are the equipment/products and services commonly used by public sector entities.
- <u>1.36</u> New Current Model Goods: Proposals submitted shall be for new, current model products and services with the exception of certain close-out products allowed to be offered on the Proposer's "Hot List" described herein.

- <u>1.37</u> Compliance with laws and standards: All items supplied on this Contract shall comply with any current applicable safety or regulatory standards or codes.
- **1.38 Delivered and operational;** Products offered herein are to be proposed based upon being delivered and operational at the NJPA Member's site. Exceptions to "delivered and operational" must be explicitly disclosed in the "Total Cost of Acquisition" section of your proposal response.
- <u>1.39</u> Warranty: The Proposer/Vendor warrants that all products, equipment, supplies, and services delivered under this Contract shall be covered by the industry standard or better warranty. All products and equipment should carry a minimum industry standard manufacturer's warranty that includes materials and labor. The Proposer has the primary responsibility to submit product specific warranty as required and accepted by industry standards. Dealer/Distributors agree to assist the purchaser in reaching a solution in a dispute over warranty's terms with the manufacturer. Any manufacturer's warranty which is effective past the expiration of the warranty will be passed on to the NJPA member. Failure to submit a minimum warranty may result in the non-award.
- <u>1.40</u> Proposer's Warrants: The Proposer warrants all goods and services furnished hereunder will be free from liens and encumbrances; and defects in design, materials, and workmanship; and will conform in all respects to the terms of this RFP including any specifications or standards. In addition, Proposer/Vendor warrants the goods and services are suitable for and will perform in accordance with the purposes for which they were intended.

G. SOLUTIONS BASED SOLICITATION

NJPA solicitations and contract process will not offer specifications for proposers or respondents to meet or base your response on. This RFP is a "Solutions Based Solicitation". This means the proposers are asked to understand and anticipate what NJPA and the NJPA current and potential member agencies located nationally needs and future needs and requirements are to include any specific, desired common specifications desired or required by law or industry standards. Your proposal will be evaluated in part by the basis of your company "solutions" and your demonstrated ability and features to meet or exceed the needs and requirements of NJPA and our member agencies.

2. DEFINITIONS

A. PROPOSER - VENDOR

- **2.1** Exclusive Vendor- A sole Vendor awarded in a product category. NJPA reserves the right to award to an Exclusive Vendor in the event that such an award is in the best interests of NJPA Members. Such a Proposer must exhibit the ability to offer an outstanding overall program and demonstrate the ability and willingness to serve NJPA Members in all 50 states, and comply with all other requirements of this RFP.
- **2.2 Potential Proposer-** A person or entity requesting a copy of this RFP.
- **2.3 Proposer-** A company, person, or entity delivering a timely response to this RFP.
- **<u>2.4</u> Vendor-** One of a number of Proposers whose proposal has been awarded a contract pursuant to this RFP.
- 2.5 Request for Proposal- Herein referred to as RFP

B. CONTRACT

<u>2.6</u> "Contract" as used herein shall mean cumulative documentation consisting of this RFP, an entire Proposer's response, and a fully executed "Acceptance and Award" pursuant to this RFP.

C. TIME

2.7 Periods of time, stated as number of days, shall be in calendar days.

D. PROPOSER'S RESPONSE

<u>2.8</u> A Proposer's Response is the entire collection of documents as they are received by NJPA from a Potential Proposer in response to this RFP.

E. CURRENCY

2.9 All transactions are payable in U.S. dollars on U.S. sales. All administrative fees are to be paid in U.S. dollars.

F. FOB

- **2.10** FOB stands for "Freight On Board" and defines the point at which responsibility for loss and damage of goods purchased are transferred from Seller to Buyer. "FOB Destination" defines the transfer of responsibility for loss are transferred from Seller to Buyer at the Buyer's designated delivery point.
- <u>2.11</u> FOB does not identify whom is responsible for the costs of shipping. The responsibility for the costs of shipping is addressed elsewhere in this document.

3. INSTRUCTIONS TO PREPARING YOUR PROPOSAL

A. PRE-PROPOSAL CONFERENCE

<u>3.1</u> A non-mandatory pre-proposal conference will be held at the date and time specified in the time line on page one of this RFP. Conference call and web connection information will be sent to all Potential Proposers through the same means employed in their inquiry. The purpose of this conference call is to allow Potential Proposers to ask questions regarding this RFP. Only answers issued in writing by NJPA to questions asked before or during the Pre-proposal Conference shall be considered binding.

B. IDENTIFICATION OF KEY PERSONNEL

- <u>3.2</u> Vendor will designate one senior staff individual who will represent the awarded Vendor to NJPA. This contact person will correspond with members for technical assistance, questions or problems that may arise including instructions regarding different contacts for different geographical areas as needed.
- <u>3.3</u> Individuals should also be identified (if applicable) as the primary contacts for the contents of this proposal, marketing, sales, and any other area deemed essential by the Proposer.

C. PROPOSER'S EXCEPTIONS TO TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- $\underline{3.4}$ Any exceptions, deviations, or contingencies a Proposer may have to the terms and conditions contained herein must be documented on Form C.
- <u>3.5</u> Exceptions, Deviations or contingencies stipulated in Proposer's Response, while possibly necessary in the view of the Proposer, may result in disqualification of a Proposal Response.

D. FORMAL INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPOSERS

- <u>3.6</u> It is the responsibility of all Proposers to examine the entire RFP package, to seek clarification of any item or requirement that may not be clear and to check all responses for accuracy before submitting a Proposal. Negligence in preparing a Proposal confers no right of withdrawal after the deadline for submission of proposals.
- 3.7 All proposals must be sent to "The National Joint Powers Alliance®, 202 12th ST NE Staples, MN 56479."
- <u>3.8</u> Format for bid response: Please use Form A as the basic format for your response. Please use the general headings in Form A to "Section" your electronic response. All proposals must be physically delivered to NJPA® at the above address in the following format:
- **3.8.1** Hard copy Original signed, completed, and dated forms A (signature page only), C,D, E, H, and I (full documents) from this RFP,
 - **3.8.2** Hard copies of all addenda issued for the RFP with original counter signed by the Proposer,
 - 3.8.3 Certificate of insurance verifying the coverage identified in this RFP,
 - <u>3.8.4</u> Two complete copies of your response on a CD (Compact Disc) or flash drive containing completed Forms A,B,C,D,E,H, and I, your statement of products and pricing together with all appropriate attachments, and a Dunn and Bradstreet report on your organization.
- <u>3.9</u> All Proposal forms must be legible. All appropriate forms must be executed by an authorized signatory of the Proposer. Blue ink is preferred for signatures.
- <u>3.10</u> Proposal submissions should be submitted using the electronic forms provided. If a Proposer chooses to use alternative documents for their response, the proposer will be responsible for ensuring the content is effectively equal to the NJPA form and the document is in a format readable by NJPA.
- <u>3.11</u> It is the responsibility of the Proposer to be certain the proposal submittal is in the physical possession of NJPA on or prior to the deadline for submission of proposals.
 - <u>3.11.1</u> Proposals must be submitted in a sealed envelope or box properly addressed to NJPA and prominently identifying the proposal number, proposal category name, the message "Hold for Proposal Opening", and the deadline for proposal submission. NJPA cannot be responsible for late receipt of proposals. Proposals received by the correct deadline for proposal submission will be opened and the name of each Proposer and other appropriate information will be publicly read.
- <u>3.12</u> Corrections, erasures, and interlineations on a Proposer's Response must be initialed by the authorized signer in original ink on all copies to be considered.
- <u>3.13</u> Addendums to the RFP: The Proposer is responsible for ensuring receipt of all addendums to this RFP.
 - <u>3.13.1</u> Proposer's are responsible for checking directly with the NJPA website for addendums to this RFP.
 - <u>3.13.2</u> Addendums to this RFP can change terms and conditions of the RFP including the deadline for submission of proposals.

F. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT THIS RFP

- <u>3.14</u> Upon examination of this RFP document, Proposer shall promptly notify the NJPA of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error they may discover. Interpretations, corrections and changes to this RFP will be made by NJPA through addendum. Interpretations, corrections, or changes made in any other manner will not be binding and Proposer shall not rely upon such.
- <u>3.15</u> Submit all questions about this RFP, in writing, referencing "POSTAGE METERS AND RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE, ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES to Gregg Meierhofer, NJPA 202 12th Street NE, Staples, MN 56479 or RFP@njpacoop.org. Those not having

access to the Internet may call Gregg Meierhofer at (218) 894-1930. Requests for additional information or interpretation of instructions to Proposers or technical specifications shall also be addressed to Gregg Meierhofer. NJPA urges Potential Proposers to communicate all concerns well in advance of the deadline to avoid misunderstandings. Questions received less than seven (7) days ending at 4:00 p.m. Central Time of the seventh (7th) calendar day prior to proposal due-date cannot be answered.

- <u>3.16</u> If the answer to a question is deemed by NJPA to have a material impact on other potential proposers or the RFP itself, the answer to the question will become an addendum to this RFP.
- 3.17 If the answer to a question is deemed by NJPA to be a clarification of existing terms and conditions and does not have a material impact on other potential proposers or the RFP itself, no further documentation of that question is required.
- <u>3.18</u> As used in this solicitation, clarification means communication with a Potential Proposer for the sole purpose of eliminating minor irregularities, informalities, or apparent clerical mistakes in the RFP.
- 3.19 Addenda are written instruments issued by NJPA that modify or interpret the RFP. All addenda issued by NJPA shall become a part of the RFP. Addenda will be delivered to all Potential Proposers using the same method of delivery of the original RFP material. NJPA accepts no liability in connection with the delivery of said materials. Copies of addenda will also be made available on the NJPA website at www.njpacoop.org by clicking on "Current Proposals" and from the NJPA offices. No questions will be accepted by NJPA later than five (5) days prior to the deadline for receipt of proposals, except an addendum withdrawing the request for proposals or one that includes postponement of the date of receipt of proposals. Each Potential Proposer shall ascertain prior to submitting a Proposal that it has received all addenda issued, and the Proposer shall acknowledge their receipt in its Proposal Response.
- <u>3.20</u> An amendment to a submitted proposal must be in writing and delivered to NJPA no later than the time specified for opening of all proposals.

G. MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF A SUBMITTED PROPOSAL

<u>3.21</u> A submitted proposal may not be modified, withdrawn from or cancelled by the Proposer for a period of ninety (90) days following the date proposals were opened regarding this RFP. **Prior** to the deadline for submission of proposals, any proposal submitted may be modified or withdrawn by notice to the NJPA Bids and Contracts Officer. Such notice shall be submitted in writing and include the signature of the Proposer and shall be delivered to NJPA prior to the deadline for submission of proposals and it shall be so worded as not to reveal the content of the original proposal. However, the original proposal shall not be physically returned to the Potential Proposer until after the official proposal opening. Withdrawn proposals may be resubmitted up to the time designated for the receipt of the proposals if they are then fully in conformance with the Instructions to Proposer.

H. VALUE ADDED ATTRIBUTES, PRODUCTS/SERVICES

- <u>3.22</u> Examples of Value Added Attributes: Value-Added attributes, products and services are items offered in addition to the products and services being proposed which adds value to those items being proposed. The availability of a contract for maintenance or service after the initial sale, installation, and set-up may, for instance, be "Value Added Services" for products where a typical buyer may not have the ability to perform these functions.
- <u>3.23</u> Where to document Value Added Attributes: The opportunity to indicate value added dimensions and such advancements will be available in the Proposer's Questionnaire and Proposer's product and service submittal.
- <u>3.24</u> Value added equipment/products and services and expanded services, as they relate to this RFP, will be given positive consideration in the award selection. Consideration will be given to an expanded selection of POSTAGE METERS AND RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE,

ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES, and advances to provide products/services, supplies meeting and/or exceeding today's industry standards and expectations. A value add would include a program or service that further serves the members needs above and possibly beyond standard expectation and complements the equipment/products and services and training. Value added could include areas of product and service, sales, ordering, delivery, performance, maintenance, technology, and service that furthers the functionality and effectiveness of the procurement process while remaining within the scope of this RFP.

- <u>3.25</u> Minority, Small Business, and Women Business Enterprise (WMBE) participation: It is the policy of some NJPA Members to involve Minority, Small Business, and WMBE contractors in the purchase of goods and services. Vendors should document WMBE status for their organization AND any such status of their affiliates (i.e. Supplier networks) involved in carrying out the activities invited. The ability of a Proposer to provide "Credits" to NJPA and NJPA Members in these subject areas, either individually or through related entities involved in the transaction, will be evaluated positively by NJPA. NJPA is committed to facilitating the realization of such "Credits" through certain structuring techniques for transactions resulting from this RFP.
- <u>3.26</u> Environmentally Preferred Purchasing Opportunities: There is a growing trend among NJPA Members to consider the environmental impact of the equipment/products and servicesthey purchase. Please identify any "Green" characteristics of the goods and services in your proposal and identify the sanctioning body determining that characteristic. Where appropriate, please indicate which products have been certified as "green" and by which certifying agency.
- <u>3.27</u> On-Line Requisitioning systems: When applicable, on-line requisitioning systems will be viewed as a value-added characteristic. Proposer shall include documentation about user interfaces that make online ordering easy for NJPA Members as well as the ability to punch-out from mainstream e-Procurement or Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) systems that NJPA Members may currently utilize.
- <u>3.28</u> **Financing:** The ability of the Proposer to provide financing options for the products and services being proposed will be viewed as a Value Added Attribute.

I. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

- <u>3.29</u> Proposer shall provide evidence of liability insurance coverage identified below in the form of an ACCORD binder form with their proposal. Upon Award issued pursuant to this contract, and prior to the execution of any commerce relating to such award, Vendor will be responsible for providing verification, in the form of an ACCORD binder identifying the coverage required below and identifying NJPA as a "Certificate Holder" and an "Additional Insured". Vendor will be responsible to maintain such insurance coverage at their own expense throughout the term of any contract resulting from this solicitation.
- **3.30** Vendor, upon award, shall be required to maintain the following insurance coverage's during the term of the NJPA Contract:
 - (1) Workers Compensation insurance (Occurrence) with the following minimum coverage's: Bodily
 - injury by accident--per employee \$100,000; Bodily injury by disease--per employee \$100,000; Policy limits \$500,000. In addition, Proposer shall require all subcontractors occupying the premises or
 - performing work under the contract to obtain an insurance certificate showing proof of Workers Compensation Coverage with the following minimum coverage's: Bodily injury by accident--per employee \$100,000; Bodily injury by disease--per employee \$100,000; Policy limits \$500,000.
 - (2) Commercial General Liability Policy per occurrence \$1,000,000.
 - (3) Business Auto Policy to include but not be limited to liability coverage on any owned, non-owned
 - and hired vehicle used by Proposer or Proposer's personnel in the performance of this Contract. The Business Automobile Policy shall have a per occurrence limit of \$1,000,000.

3.31 The foregoing policies shall contain a provision that coverage afforded under the policies will not be canceled, or not renewed or allowed to lapse for any reason until at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to NJPA. Certificates of Insurance showing such coverage to be in force shall be filed with NJPA prior to commencement of any work under the contract. The foregoing policies shall be obtained from insurance companies licensed to do business nationally and shall be with companies acceptable to NJPA, which must have a minimum AM Best rating of A-. All such coverage shall remain in full force and effect during the term and any renewal or extension thereof.

J. ORDER PROCESS AND/OR FUNDS FLOW

<u>3.32</u> Please propose an order process and funds flow. Please choose from one of the following:

<u>3.32.1</u> B-TO-G: The Business-to-Government order process and/or funds flow model involves NJPA Members issuing Purchase Orders directly to a Vendor and pursuant to a Contract resulting from this RFP.

3.32.3 Other: Please fully identify.

K. ADMINISTRATIVE FEES

- <u>3.33</u> Proposer agrees to authorize and/or allow for an administrative fee payable to NJPA by an Awarded Vendor in exchange for its facilitation and marketing of a Contract resulting from this RFP to current and potential NJPA Members. This Administration Fee shall be:
 - <u>3.33.1</u> Calculated as a percentage of the dollar volume of all equipment/products and servicesprovided to and purchased by NJPA Members or calculated as reasonable and acceptable method applicable to the contracted transaction, and
 - **3.33.2** Included in, and not added to, the pricing included in Proposer's Response to this RFP, and
 - <u>3.33.3</u> Designed to offset the anticipated costs of NJPA's involvement in facilitating the establishment, Vendor training, and the order/product/funds flow of the Contract resulting from this RFP, and other uses as deemed appropriate by NJPA's Board of Directors from time to time.
 - **3.33.3.1** Typical administrative fees for a B-TO-G order process and funds flow is 2.0%.
- <u>3.34</u> The opportunity to propose these factors and an appropriate administrative fee is available in the Proposer's Questionnaire.

4. PRICING STRATEGIES

- **4.1** NJPA requests Potential Proposers respond to this RFP only if they are able to offer a wide array of equipment/products and services and at prices lower and better value than what they would ordinarily offer to single government agency, larger school district, or regional cooperative.
- **4.2** RFP is an "Indefinite Quantity Product/Service Price Request" with potential national sales distribution and service. Proposers are agreeing to fulfill Contract obligations regarding each product/service to which you provide a description and a price. If Proposer's solution requires additional supporting documentation, describe where it can be found in your submission. If Proposer offers the solution in an alternative fashion, describe your solution to be easily understood. All pricing must be copied on a CD along with other requested information as a part of a Proposer's Response.
- **4.3** Regardless of the payment method selected by NJPA or NJPA Member, a total cost associated with any purchase option of the equipment/products and services and being supplied must always be disclosed at the time of purchase.
- 4.4 Primary Pricing/Secondary Pricing Strategies- All Proposers will be required to submit "Primary

Pricing" in the form of either "Line-Item Pricing," or "Percentage Discount from Catalog Pricing," or a combination of these pricing strategies. Proposers are also encouraged to offer OPTIONAL pricing strategies including "Hot List," "Sourced Goods," and "Volume Discounts," as well as financing options such as leasing.

A. LINE-ITEM PRICING

- **4.5 Line-Item pricing-** A pricing format where specific individual products and/or services are offered at specific individual Contract prices. Products and/or services are individually priced and described by characteristics such as manufacture name, stock or part number, size, or functionality. This method of pricing offers the least amount of confusion as products and prices are individually identified, however Proposers with a large number of products to propose may find this method cumbersome. In these situations, a percentage discount from catalog or category pricing model may make more sense.
- **4.6** All Line-Item Pricing items must be numbered, organized, sectioned, including SKU's (when applicable) and easily understood by the Proposal Review Committee and members.
- <u>4.7</u> Line-Item Pricing items are to be submitted in an Excel spreadsheet format provided and are to include all appropriate identification information necessary to discern the line item from other line items in each Proposer's proposal.
- <u>4.8</u> The purpose for the excel spreadsheet format for Line-Item Pricing is to be able to use the "Find" function to quickly find any particular item of interest. For that reason, Proposers are responsible for providing the appropriate product and service identification information along with the pricing information which is typically found on an invoice or price quote for such products and services.
- **4.9** All products and services typically appearing on an invoice or price quote must be individually priced and identified on the line-item price sheet, including any and all ancillary costs.
- **4.10** Proposers are asked to provide both a "List" price as well as a "Proposed Contract Price" in their pricing matrix. "List" price will be the standard "quantity of one" price currently available to government and educational customers excluding cooperative and volume discounts

B. PERCENTAGE DISCOUNT FROM CATALOG OR CATEGORY

- <u>4.11</u> Percent Discount From Catalog, List or Category Pricing- A specific percentage discount from a "Catalogue or List Price" defined as a Manufacturer's Suggested Retail Price (MSRP) for the products or services being proposed.
- **4.12** Individualized percentage discounts can be applied individually to any number of defined product groupings.
- **4.13** A Percentage Discount from MSRP may be applied to all elements identified in MSRP including the base vehicle AND all Manufacturer Options.
- **4.14** Dealer supplied Options will be priced using a "Sourced Goods Multiplier" as defined herein.
- <u>4.15</u> When a Proposer elects to use "Percentage Discount from Catalog or Category," Proposer will be responsible for providing and maintaining current "MSRP" with NJPA both in their proposal and throughout the term of any Contract resulting from this RFP.
- **4.16** NJPA reserves the right to review catalogs submitted to determine if the represented products and services reflect the scope of this bid. Each new catalog received may have the effect of adding new product offerings and deleting products no longer carried by the Vendor. New catalogs shall apply to the

Contract only upon approval of the NJPA. Non-approved use of catalogs may result in termination for convenience. New price lists or catalogs found to be offering non-contract items during the Contract may be grounds for terminating the Contract for convenience. New optional accessories for equipment may be added to the Contract at the time they become available.

C. HOT LIST PRICING

- **4.17** Where applicable, NJPA also invites the Vendor, at their option, to offer a specific selection of products/services, defined as a Hot List Pricing, at greater discounts than those listed in the standard Contract pricing. All product/service pricing, including the Hot List Pricing, must be submitted in hard copy as well as electronically provided in Excel format. Hot List pricing must be submitted in a Line-Item format. Providing a "Hot List" of equipment/products and services is optional. Equipment/products and services may be added or removed from the "Hot List" at any time provided that current "Hot List" prices are provided to NJPA at all times.
- **4.18** Hot List pricing when applicable may also be used to discount and liquidate close-out and discontinued equipment/products and services as long as those close-out and discontinued items are clearly labeled as such. Current ordering process and administrative fees apply. This option must be published and made available to all NJPA Members.
- **4.19** Hot List Pricing is allowed to change at the discretion of the Vendor within the definition of Hot List Pricing. The Vendor is responsible to maintain current Hot List product/service descriptions and Pricing with NJPA.

D. CEILING PRICE

- <u>4.20</u> Proposal pricing is to be established as a ceiling price. At no time may the proposed equipment/products and services be offered pursuant to this Contract at prices above this ceiling price without approval by NJPA. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** Contract prices may be reduced to allow for volume considerations and commitments and to meet the specific and unique needs of an NJPA Member.
- **4.21** Allowable specific needs may include competitive situations, certain purchase volume commitments or the creation of custom programs based on the individual needs of NJPA Members.

E. VOLUME PRICE DISCOUNTS

- <u>4.22</u> Proposers are free to offer volume discounts from the contract pricing documented in a Contract resulting from this RFP. Volume considerations shall be determined between the Vendor and individual NJPA Members on a case-by-case basis.
- <u>4.23</u> Nothing in this Contract establishes a favored member relationship between the NJPA or any NJPA Member and the Vendor. The Vendor will, upon request by NJPA Member, extend this same reduced price offered or delivered to another NJPA Member provided the same or similar volume commitment, specific needs, terms, and conditions, a similar time frame, seasonal considerations, locations, competitively situations and provided the same manufacturer support is available to the Vendor.
- <u>4.24</u> All price adjustments are to be offered equally to all NJPA Members exhibiting the same or substantially similar characteristics such as purchase volume commitments, and timing including the availability of special pricing from the Vendor's suppliers.

F. SOURCED GOODS

<u>4.25</u> NJPA and NJPA Members may, from time to time, request goods and/or equipment/products and services within the scope of this RFP which are not included in an awarded Vendor's line-item product /service listing or "list or catalog" known as Sourced Goods.

- **4.26** An awarded Vendor resulting from this RFP may "Source" these equipment/products and services for NJPA or NJPA Member to the extent they:
 - **4.26.1** Include in their bid response a cost-plus-percentage-of-cost pricing factor for such Sourced goods and services, and
 - **4.26.2** Provide as many quotes for the Member's "Total Cost of Acquisition" for the goods and services to be sourced as may reasonably be required by NJPA Member.
 - **4.26.3** Provide "Sourced Goods" only to the extent that they are incidental to the total transaction being contemplated.

G. COST PLUS A PERCENTAGE OF COST

4.27 Except as provided in "Sourced Goods" above, cost plus a percentage of cost as a primary pricing mechanism is not desirable.

H. TOTAL COST OF ACQUISITION

- **4.28** The Total Cost of Acquisition for the equipment/products and services being proposed, including those payable by NJPA Members to either the Proposer or a third party, shall be defined as:
 - The cost of the proposed goods and services delivered and operational for its intended purpose in the end-user's location.
- 4.29 For example, if you are proposing a materials only "Warehouse Goods" contract FOB Proposer's dock and physically at the Proposer's dock, your proposal would identify your deviation from the "The Total Cost of Acquisition" is to be "Proposal does not provide for delivery beyond Proposer's dock, nor any set-up activities or costs associated with those delivery or set-up activities." In contrast, proposed terms including all costs for goods and services delivered and operational at to the end-user's location would require a disclosure of "None"

I. REQUESTING PRODUCT AND SERVICE ADDITIONS/DELETIONS

- **4.30** Requests for product, service, and price additions, deletions, or changes must be made in written form and shall be subject to approval by NJPA.
- 4.31 New equipment/products and services may be added to a Contract resulting from this RFP at any time during that Contract to the extent those equipment/products and services are within the scope of this RFP. Those requests are subject to review and approval of NJPA. Allowable new equipment/products and services generally include new updated models of equipment/products and services and or enhanced services previously offered which could reflect new technology and improved functionality.
- <u>4.32</u> Proposers representing multiple manufacturers, or carrying multiple related product lines may also request the addition of new manufacturers or product lines to their Contract to the extent they remain within the scope of this RFP.
- <u>4.33</u> NJPA's due diligence in analyzing any request for change is to determine if approval of the request is 1) within the scope of the original RFP, and 2) in the "Best Interests of NJPA and NJPA Members." We are looking for consistent pricing and delivery mechanisms and an understanding of what value the proposal brings to NJPA and NJPA Members.
- 4.34 Documenting the "Best Interests of NJPA and NJPA Members" when outdated equipment is being deleted is fairly straight forward since the product is no longer available and not relevant to the

procurement Contract.

- 4.35 Requests must be in the form of 1) a cover letter to NJPA a) asking to add the product line, b) making a general statement identifying how the products to be added are within the scope of the original RFP, and c) making a general statement identifying that, if appropriate, the pricing is consistent with the existing Contract pricing and 2) the detail as to what is being added at what price will then be an attachment to that cover letter.
- **4.36** NJPA's intent here is to encourage Proposers to provide and document NJPA's due diligence in a clear and concise one page format on which we can stamp and sign our acknowledgment and acceptance. This information must ultimately come from Proposers, and NJPA is requiring it in this format.

J. REQUESTING PRICING CHANGES

- <u>4.37</u> Price Decreases: Requests for standard Contract price decrease adjustments (percentage discount increases) are encouraged and will be allowed at any time based on market place efficiencies, market place competitiveness, improved technologies and/or improved methods of delivery or if Vendor engages in innovative procurement practices such as strategic sourcing, aggregate and volume purchasing. NJPA expects Vendors to propose their very best prices and anticipates price reductions due to the advancement of technologies and market place efficiencies. Documenting the "Best Interests of NJPA and NJPA Members" is pretty easy when we are documenting price reductions.
- 4.38 Price increases: Requests for standard contract price increases (or the inclusion of new generation products/services/services at higher prices) can be made at any time. These requests will again be evaluated by NJPA based on the best interests of NJPA and NJPA Members. As an example, typically acceptable requests for price increases for existing equipment/products and services may cite increases to the Vendor of input costs such as petroleum or other applicable commodities. Typically acceptable requests for price increases for new equipment/products and services enhance or improve on the current solutions currently offered as well as cite increases in utility of the new compared to the old. Vendors are requested to reasonably document the claims cited in their requests. Your written request for a price increase, therefore, is an exercise in describing what you need, and a justification for why you need it in sufficient detail for NJPA to deem such change to be in the best interests of our self and our Members.
- **4.39 Price Change Request Format**: An awarded Proposer will use the format of a cover letter requesting price increases in general terms (a 5% increase in product line X) and stating their justification for that price increase (due to the recent increase in petroleum costs) by product category. Specific details for the requested price change must be attached to the request letter identifying product/services where appropriate, both current and proposed pricing. Attachments such as letters from suppliers announcing price increases are appropriate for documenting your requests here.

K. PRICE AND PRODUCT CHANGES FORMAT

4.40 NJPA's due diligence regarding product and price change requests is to consider the reasonableness of the request and document consideration on behalf of our members. We would appreciate it if you would send the following documentation to request a pricing change:

4.40.1 A cover letter:

- a. Please address the following subjects in your cover letter:
 - i. What product/service prices are changing?
 - ii. How much are the prices changing?
 - iii. Why are the prices changing?
 - iv. Any additions or deletions from the previous product list and the reason for the changes.
- b. The specifics of the product/services and price changes will be listed in the excel spreadsheets identified below. Please take a more general "Disclosure" approach to

identifying changes in the cover letter.

- i. If appropriate, **for example**, state, "All paper equipment/products and services increased 5 % in price due to transportation costs."
- ii. If appropriate, for instance, state, "The 6400 series floor polisher added to the product list is the new model replacing the 5400 series. The 6400's 3% price increase reflects the rate of inflation over the past year. The 5400 series is now included in the "Hot List" at a 20% discount from previous pricing until remaining inventory is liquidated."
- **4.40.2** An excel spreadsheet identifying all equipment/products and services being offered and their pricing. Each subsequent pricing update will be saved using the naming convention of "(Vendor Name) pricing effective XX/XX/XXXX."
 - a. Include all equipment/products and services regardless of whether their prices have changed. By observing this convention we will:
 - i. Reduce confusion by providing a single, easy to find, current pricing sheet for each Vendor.
 - ii. Create a historical record of pricing.

L. SINGLE STATEMENT OF PRICING/HISTORICAL RECORD OF PRICING

- **4.41** Initially; and with each request for product addition, deletion, and pricing change; all equipment/products and services and services available, and the prices for those equipment/products and services and services will be stated in an Excel workbook. The request for price changes described above will serve as the documentation for those requested changes. Each complete pricing list will be identified by its "Effective Date." Each successive price listing identified by its "Effective Date" will create a "Product and Price History" for the Contract.
- **4.42** Proposers may use the multiple tabs available in an Excel workbook to separately list logical product groupings or to separately list product and service pricing as they see fit.
- **4.43** All equipment/products and services together with their pricing, whether changed within the request or remaining unchanged, will be stated on each "Pricing" sheet created as a result of each request for product, service, or pricing change.
- **4.44** Each subsequent "Single Statement of Product and Pricing" will be archived by its effective date therefore creating a product and price history for any Contract resulting from this RFP.

M. PAYMENT TERMS

- <u>4.45</u> Payment terms will be defined by the Proposer in the Proposer's Response. Proposers are encouraged to offer payment terms through P Card services.
- **4.46** Leasing- If available, identify any leasing programs available to NJPA and NJPA Members as part of your proposed. Proposers should submit an example of the lease agreement to be used. Proposers should identify:
 - General leasing terms such as:
 - o The percentage adjustment over/under an index rate used in calculating the internal rate of return for the lease; and
 - o The index rate being adjusted; and
 - o The "Purchase Option" at lease maturity (\$1, or fair market value); and
 - The available term in months of lease(s) available.
 - Leasing company information such as:
 - o The name and address of the leasing company; and
 - o Any ownership, common ownership, or control between the Proposer and the Leasing

N. SALES TAX

<u>4.47</u> Sales and other taxes, where applicable, shall not be included in the prices quoted. Vendor will charge state and local sales and other taxes on items for which a valid tax exemption certification has not been provided. Each NJPA Member is responsible for providing verification of tax exempt status to Vendor. When ordering, if applicable, NJPA Members must indicate that they are tax exempt entities. Except as set forth herein, no party shall be responsible for taxes imposed on another party as a result of or arising from the transactions contemplated by a Contract resulting from this RFP.

O. SHIPPING AND SHIPPING PROGRAM

- <u>4.48</u> Shipping program for material only proposals, or sections of proposals, must be defined as a part of the cost of goods. If shipping is charged to NJPA or NJPA Member, only the actual cost of delivery may be added to an invoice. Shipping charges calculated as a percentage of the product price may not be used, unless such charges are lower than actual delivery charges. No COD orders will be accepted. It is desired that delivery be made within ninety-days (90) of receipt of the Purchase Order.
- **4.49** Any shipping cost charged to NJPA or NJPA Members will be considered to be part of "proposal pricing."
- **4.50** Additional costs for expedited deliveries will be at the additional shipping or handling expense to the NJPA Member.
- **4.51** Selection of a carrier for shipment will be the option of the party paying for said shipping. Use of another carrier will be at the expense of the requester.
- **4.52** Proposers must define their shipping programs for Alaska and Hawaii and any location not served by conventional shipping services. Over-size and over-weight items and shipments may be subject to custom freight programs.
- 4.53 Proposals containing restocking fees are less advantageous than those not containing re-stocking fees. That being said, certain industries cannot avoid restocking fees. Certain industries providing made to order goods may not allow returns. With regard to returns and restocking fees, Proposers will be evaluated based on the relative flexibility extended to NJPA and NJPA Members relating to those subjects. Where used, restocking fees in excess of 15% will not be considered excessive. Restocking fees may be waived, at the option of the Proposer/Vendor. Indicate all shipping and re-stocking fees in price program.
- <u>4.54</u> Proposer agrees shipping errors will be at the expense of the Vendor. For example, if a Vendor ships a product that was not ordered by the member, it is the responsibility of the Vendor to pay for return mail or shipment at the convenience of the member.
- <u>4.55</u> Unless specifically stated otherwise in the "Shipping Program" of a Proposer's Response, all prices quoted must be F.O.B. destination with the freight prepaid by the Vendor. Time is of the essence on this Contract. If completed deliveries are not made at the time agreed, NJPA or NJPA Member reserves the right to cancel and purchase elsewhere and hold Vendor accountable. If delivery dates cannot be met, Vendor agrees to advise NJPA or NJPA Member of the earliest possible shipping date for acceptance by NJPA or NJPA Member.

- <u>4.56</u> Goods and materials must be properly packaged. Damaged goods and materials will not be accepted, or if the damage is not readily apparent at the item of delivery, the goods shall be returned at no cost to NJPA or NJPA Member. NJPA and NJPA Members reserve the right to inspect the goods at a reasonable time subsequent to delivery where circumstances or conditions prevent effective inspection of the goods at the time of delivery.
- **4.57** Vendor shall deliver Contract conforming products in each shipment and may not substitute products without approval from NJPA Member.
- 4.58 NJPA reserves the right to declare a breach of Contract if the Vendor intentionally delivers substandard or inferior products which are not under Contract and described in its paper or electronic price lists or sourced upon request to any member under this Contract. In the event of the delivery of a non-conforming product, NJPA Member will immediately notify Vendor and Vendor will replace non-conforming product with conforming product.
- **4.59** Throughout the term of the Contract, Proposer agrees to pay for return shipment on goods that arrive in a defective or inoperable condition. Proposer must arrange for the return shipment of damaged goods.
- <u>4.60</u> Unless contrary to other parts of this solicitation, if the goods or the tender of delivery fail in any respect to conform to this Contract, the purchasing member may: 1) reject the whole, 2) accept the whole or 3) accept any commercial unit or units and reject the rest.

P. NORMAL WORKING HOURS

<u>4.61</u> Prices quoted are for equipment/products and services delivered during normal business hours. Normal Business hours will be as specifically defined herein, defined through industry standards OR defined through statement contained in the purchase/work order issued pursuant to a Contract resulting from this RFP.

5. MARKETING PLAN

- <u>5.1</u> Internal Marketing Plan: Our sales force is your sales force. If you are awarded a contract based on this solicitation your sales force will be the primary driver of everyone's success. Your sales person is only minor interested in the fact that:
 - The use of the NJPA Contract will save their customer (NJPA's Member) the time and effort of bringing a new individual Invitation for Bids (IFB);
 - The use of the NJPA Contract will guaranty their ability to choose you

An award of Contract resulting from this RFP is an opportunity for the awarded contractor to pursue commerce with, and deliver value to NJPA and NJPA Members nationwide. An award of Contract is not an opportunity to see how much business NJPA can drive to an awarded Vendor's door. Your internal marketing plan should serve to:

- <u>5.1.1</u> Identify the appropriate levels of sales management whom will need to understand the value of, and the internal procedures necessary to deliver this Contract opportunity to NJPA and NJPA Members through your sales force.
- <u>5.1.2</u> Identify, in general, your national foot print and dedicated feet-on-the-street sales force that will be carrying this Contract message and opportunity in the field to NJPA Members. Outline the sale force in terms of numbers and geographic distribution.
 - **5.1.2.1** Identify whether your sales force are employees or independent contractors.

- <u>**5.1.3**</u> Identify your plan for delivering training to these individuals.
 - **5.1.3.1** Will you have your sales force gathered at national or regional events in the near future? Does you sales force have the ability to participate in webinar or webcast events?
 - <u>5.1.3.2</u> NJPA is prepared to provide our personnel in your location for sales training and/or on a webinar or webcast where sufficient efficiencies can be shown in reaching the appropriate groups within your employee base, and sufficient numbers of personnel trained.
- **<u>5.1.4</u>** Identify your personnel involved in training.
 - <u>5.1.4.1</u> NJPA can provide personnel to deliver training regarding the Contract itself, the authority of NJPA to offer the Contract vehicle to its Members, the value the Contract vehicle delivers to NJPA and NJPA Members, the scope of NJPA Membership, and the authority of NJPA Members to utilize our procurement contracts.
 - <u>5.1.4.2</u> Your personnel will be needed to provide training regarding employee compensation and internal procedures when delivering the Contract opportunity, and how this Contract purchasing opportunity relates with other such opportunities available.
- <u>5.2</u> Success in marketing is dependent upon 1) the delivery of value as defined in section 1.4, 2) the delivery of knowledge of the program and its proper use and utility, and 3) the delivery of opportunity and reward which creates a personal commitment to the program. NJPA desires a marketing plan that:
 - <u>5.2.1</u> identifies the value delivered in a competitively proposed national cooperative procurement contract by relieving both the NJPA Member and the Vendor/Vendor's sales staff of the responsibility for bringing and answering many similar and individual RFP's; and
 - <u>5.2.2</u> identifies the appropriate Vendor personnel from both management and sales staff who will be trained on the use and utility of such a contract and a general schedule of when and how those individuals will be trained; and
 - <u>5.2.3</u> identifies in general how the reward system for the marketing, delivery, and service chain of the Vendor will be affected by the implementation of the proposed Contract and how that will be proposed to those individuals in terms of the value created for them and their departments in 5.1.1 above.
- <u>5.3</u> External Marketing Plan: NJPA is seeking the ability to serve all our current and potential members nationwide. The Proposer must demonstrate the ability to both market and service their products/services/services nationwide. Please demonstrate your sales and service force contains sufficient people in sufficient proximities, to receive the knowledge, opportunity, and reward in order to make a personal commitment to serving NJPA and NJPA Members nationwide.
- <u>5.4</u> The Proposer must exhibit the willingness and ability to develop marketing materials and participate in marketing venues such as:
 - <u>5.4.1</u> <u>Printed Marketing Materials</u>. Proposer will initially produce and thereafter maintain full color print advertisements in camera ready electronic format including company logos, identifying the Vendor, the Vendor's general utility for NJPA and NJPA Members, and contact information to be used by NJPA and NJPA Members in a full page, half page, and quarter page formats. These advertisements will be used in the NJPA Catalog and publications.
 - <u>5.4.2</u> <u>Press releases and advertisements</u>. Proposer will identify a marketing plan identifying their anticipated press releases, contract announcements, advertisements in industry periodicals, or

other direct or indirect marketing activities.

<u>5.4.3</u> <u>Proposer's Website</u>. Proposer will identify how an Awarded Contract will be displayed on the Proposer's website. An on-line shopping experience for NJPA and NJPA Members is desired when applicable and will be viewed as a value-added attribute to a Proposer's Response.

<u>5.4.4</u> <u>Trade Shows.</u> Proposer will outline their proposed involvement in the promotion of a Contract resulting from this RFP through trade shows. Vendors are encouraged to identify tradeshow, and other appropriate venues, for the promotion of any such Contract. Vendors are strongly encouraged to participate in cooperation with NJPA at the following NJPA embraced trade shows:

NAEP National Association of Education Procurement

I-ASBO International Association of School Business Officials

NIGP National Institute of Government Purchasing

<u>5.5</u> **Proposer must** also work in cooperation with NJPA to develop a marketing strategy and provide avenues to equally market and drive sales through the Contract and program to all NJPA Members nationally. Awarded Vendor agrees to actively market in cooperation with NJPA all available equipment/products and services to current and potential NJPA Members. NJPA reserves the right to deem a proposer non-responsive or to waive an award based on an unacceptable marketing plan.

<u>5.6</u> As a part of this response, submit a complete Marketing Plan on how you would help NJPA rollout this program to current and potential NJPA Members. NJPA requires the Vendor actively promote the Contract in cooperation with the NJPA. Vendors are advised to consider marketing efforts in the areas of 1) Website Link from Vendors website to NJPA's website, 2) Attendance and participation with a display booth at national trade shows as agreed upon/required by NJPA, and 3) Sales team and sales training programs involving both Vendor sales management and NJPA staff. NJPA requires awarded Vendors to offer the NJPA Contract opportunity to all current and qualified NJPA Members.

<u>5.7</u> **Facilitating NJPA Membership:** Proposer should express their commitment to determine the membership status of their customers whom are eligible for NJPA Membership, AND their commitment to establishing that membership.

<u>5.7.1</u> Membership information: Proposer should further express their commitment to capturing sufficient member information as is deemed necessary by NJPA to appropriately facilitate membership and certain marketing activities as agreed to by NJPA and an Awarded contractor.

6. PROPOSAL OPENING PROCEDURE

6.1 Sealed and properly identified Proposer's Responses for this RFP entitled "POSTAGE METERS AND RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE, ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES" will be received by Gregg Meierhofer, Bids and Contracts Officer, at NJPA Offices, 202 12th Street NE, Staples, MN 56479 until the deadline for receipt of, and bid opening identified on page one of this RFP. The NJPA Director of Contracts and Marketing, or Representative from the NJPA Proposal Review Committee, will then read the Proposer's names aloud. A summary of the responses to this RFP will be made available for public inspection in the NJPA office in Staples, MN. A letter or e-mail request is required to receive a complete RFP package. Send or communicate all requests to the attention of Gregg Meierhofer 202 12th Street Northeast Staples, MN 56479 or RFP@njpacoop.org to receive a complete copy of this RFP. Method of delivery needs to be indicated in the request; an email address is required for electronic transmission. Oral, facsimile, telephone or telegraphic Proposal Submissions or requests for this RFP are invalid and will not receive consideration. All Proposal Responses must be submitted in a sealed package. The outside of the package shall plainly identify "POSTAGE METERS AND

RELATED MAILING EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE, ACCESSORIES AND SUPPLIES" To avoid premature opening, it is the responsibility of the Proposer to label the Proposal Response properly.

7. EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS

A. PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS

- **7.1** NJPA will use a 1,000 Point Evaluation System to help determine the best overall Proposer(s) selection. Bonus points may be available for specific proposal characteristics identified such as "Green Product Certifications."
- <u>7.2</u> NJPA reserves the right to use a "Cost Scoring Evaluation" through a product comparison process of like products/services. This process will establish points for submitted price levels. See Cost Scoring Evaluation.
- <u>7.3</u> NJPA shall use a final overall scoring system to include consideration for best price and cost evaluation. The total possible score is 1,000 points. NJPA reserves the right to assign any number of point awards or penalties it considers warranted if a Proposer stipulates exceptions, exclusions, or limitations of liabilities.
- <u>7.4</u> To qualify for the final evaluation, a Proposer must have been deemed responsive as a result of the criteria set forth under "Proposer Responsiveness."
- <u>7.5</u> Responses will be evaluated first for responsiveness and thereafter for content. The NJPA Board of Directors will make awards to the selected Proposer(s) based on the recommendations of the Proposal Review Committee.
- <u>7.6</u> The procurement activities of the NJPA Proposal Review Committee are limited to document preparation, answering Proposer questions, advertising the solicitation, distribution of this RFP upon request, conducting an evaluation and making recommendation for possible approval to NJPA Board of Directors.

B. PROPOSER RESPONSIVENESS

- <u>7.7</u> Proposer's Responses received after the deadline for submission will be invalid and returned to the Potential Proposer unopened.
- <u>7.8</u> An essential part of the proposal evaluation process is an evaluation to qualify the Proposer being considered. All proposals must contain answers or responses to the information requested in the proposal forms. Any Proposer failing to provide the required documentation may be considered non-responsive.
- <u>7.9</u> Deviations or exceptions stipulated in Proposer's Response may result in the proposal being classified as non-responsive.
- <u>7.10</u> To qualify for evaluation, a proposal must have been submitted on time and materially satisfy all mandatory requirements identified in this document. A proposal must reasonably and substantially conform to all the terms and conditions in the solicitation to be considered responsive.
- 7.11 The Proposal Review Committee shall utilize the following criteria to evaluate all proposals received. Items 1-4 constitute the test for "Level One Responsiveness" and are determined on the proposal opening date. "Level 2" responsiveness is determined through the evaluation of the remaining items listed below. These items are not arranged in order of importance and each item may encompass multiple areas of information requested.
 - 1. The proposal response is received prior to the deadline for submission.

- 2. The proposal package was properly addressed and identified as a sealed bid with a specific opening date and time.
- 3. The proposal response contains the required certificate of liability insurance.
- 4. The proposal response contains original signatures on all documents requiring such.
- 5. Response's conformance to terms and conditions as described in the solicitation, including documentation.
- 6. Possesses qualifications as a responding Proposer that meets or exceeds those set within the solicitation.
- 7. Information from references and past performance information including past member approval.
- 8. Demonstrates that they offer the most current industry standard equipment/products and services and/or services.
- 9. Demonstrates financial stability and a favorable banking line of credit.
- 10. Demonstrates their equipment/products and services and/or services proposed meet and/or exceed industry standards accepted by educational or governmental institutions.
- 11. Has demonstrated market place success and their past performance exhibit an acceptable reputation.
- 12. Demonstrates the company possesses the background, knowledge, capacity, and ability to sell, deliver, and support equipment/products and services offered to Members.
- 13. Has provided documentation defining, outlining, and describing their concept of a national marketing program they will be implementing to facilitate and coordinate the cooperative activities required by an awarded Contract.
- 14. Has provided all of the required and applicable documentation required i.e. insurance certificates, licenses, and/or registration certificates required to do business nationally.
- 15. Line-Item Pricing, in approved excel format, listing of all of the proposed equipment/products and services and warranty provisions with their associated units of costs.
- 16. Core List selection of equipment/products and services in Line-Item Pricing format
- 17. Hot List Pricing equipment/products and services in a Line-Item Pricing format (where applicable).
- 18. Contract Pricing submitted as requested to include core list or products/services, Line-Item Pricing and/or Percentage Discount from published gov/ed price list or Catalog.

C. PROPOSAL EVALUATION CRITERIA

- <u>7.12</u> If a manufacturer or supplier chooses not to produce or supply goods and services to meet the scope of this RFP, such action will be considered sufficient cause to reduce evaluation points.
- <u>7.13</u> Consideration will be given in the award based on the completion and degree of information provided regarding available products, equipment, and accessories, as well as, applicable parts of the Proposer Information and Questionnaire.
- <u>7.14</u> The fact a manufacturer or supplier chooses not to produce or provide equipment products or services to meet the intent and scope of this RFP will not be considered sufficient cause to adjudge this RFP as restrictive.
- <u>7.15</u> The Proposer is required to have extensive knowledge and at least three (3) years of experience with the related activities surrounding the selling of the equipment, service or related products offered.
- **7.16** NJPA reserves the right to accept or reject newly formed companies solely based on information provided in the proposal and/or its own investigation of the company.
- <u>7.17</u> Consideration will be given in the proposal evaluation based upon the selection, variety, technological advances, and demonstrated quality of products submitted, technological advances, and pricing. The ability of the Proposer to communicate the value of these factors and to demonstrate how the depth and breadth of their product and service offerings provide NJPA and NJPA Members with a sole

source of responsibility within the scope of this RFP will be positively reviewed.

- <u>7.18</u> Consideration will also be given to proposals demonstrating technological advances, provide increased efficiencies, expanded service and other related improvements beyond today's NJPA member's needs and applicable standards.
- <u>7.19</u> Strong consideration will be given to a Proposer's past performance, distribution model, and the demonstration their ability to effectively market and service NJPA Membership nationally.
- <u>7.20</u> Strong consideration will be given to the best price as it relates to the quality of the product and service. However, price is ultimately one of the factors taken into consideration in evaluation and award.
- <u>7.21</u> Evaluation of a Proposer's Responses will take into consideration as a minimum response but not necessarily limited to the following:
 - 1. Adherence to all requirements of this RFP as defined by industry standards.
 - 2. Prior knowledge of and experience with a Proposer in terms of past performance and market place success.
 - 3. Capability of meeting or exceeding current and future needs or requirements of NJPA and NJPA Members.
 - 4. Evaluation of Proposer's ability to market to and provide service to all NJPA Members nationally.
 - 5. Financial condition of the Proposer.
 - 6. Nature and extent of company data furnished in Proposer's Response.
 - 7. Quality of products, equipment, and services offered including value added related services.
 - 8. History of member service to NJPA type customers.
 - 9. Overall ability to perform sales, solutions and contract support as submitted.
 - 10. Ability to meet service and warranty needs.
 - 11. History of meeting shipping and delivery expectations of contracted products/ services.
 - 12. Technology advancements and related provisions.
 - 13. Ability to market and promote the Contract within current business practices.
 - 14. Willingness to develop and enter into NJPA Contract and business relations.
 - 15. Favorable bond rating and applicable industry standard licensing ability.
 - 16. Past market place successes and brand recognition.
 - 17. Demonstrated warranty and product/service responsibility.
- 7.22 The Proposer's ability to follow the proposal preparation instructions set forth in this solicitation will also be considered to be an indicator of the Proposer's ability to follow other future instructions should they receive an award as a result of this solicitation. Any Contract between NJPA and a Proposer requires the delivery of information and data. The quality of organization and writing reflected in the proposal will be considered an indication of the quality of organization and writing which would be prevalent if a Contract was awarded. As a result, the proposal will be evaluated as a sample of data submission.
- <u>7.23</u> Proposer's Dunn and Bradstreet reports- The Proposer's Dunn and Bradstreet report are requested and reviewed to get a general feel for the size, strength, and probable scope of the Proposer.
- <u>7.24</u> NJPA reserves the right to reject the Proposer's Response of the apparent successful Proposer where the available evidence or information does not exhibit the ability or intent to satisfy NJPA that the potential Vendor is unable to properly carry out the terms of this RFP and potential Contract.
- <u>7.25</u> NJPA shall reserve the right to reject any or all proposals. NJPA also reserves the right to reject a proposal not accompanied by required certificate of insurance, other data required by this RFP, or if a Proposer's Response is incomplete or irregular. The NJPA shall reject all proposals where there has been collusion among the Proposers.

<u>7.26</u> Overall Evaluation (FORM G) - The NJPA Proposal Review Committee will evaluate proposal received based on a 1,000 point evaluation system. The Committee will establish both the evaluation criteria and designate the relative importance of those criteria by assigning possible scores for each category.

7.27 Bonus Evaluation Points- Bonus evaluation points may be awarded by the NJPA Proposal Review Committee based on criteria identified as being both "optional" and "having additional value"

D. COST SCORING EVALUATION

<u>7.28</u> NJPA reserves the right to use this process in the event the evaluation committee feels it is necessary to make a final determination.

7.29 This process will be based on a point system with points being awarded for being low to high Proposer for each cost evaluation item selected. A "Market Basket" of identical (or substantially similar) equipment/products and services may be selected by the NJPA proposal Review Committee and the unit cost will be used as a basis for determining the point value. The "Market Basket:" will be selected by NJPA from all product categories as determined appropriate by NJPA. The low priced Proposer will receive the full point value and all other Proposers will receive points as follows: Lowest price Proposal = 5 (where there are five proposers), and inferior proposals = 4, 3, 2, 1 points each. The Total Score for each proposer will be the sum of all points earned. The result of this process shall not be the sole determination for award.

E. PRODUCT TESTING

<u>7.30</u> NJPA reserves the right to request and test equipment/products and services and/or services from the apparent successful Proposer. Prior to the award of the Contract, the apparent successful Proposer, if requested by NJPA, shall furnish current information and data regarding the Proposer's resources, personnel, and organization within three (3) days.

F. PAST PERFORMANCE INFORMATION

<u>7.31</u> Past performance information is relevant information regarding a Proposer's actions under previously awarded contracts to schools, local, state, and governmental agencies and non-profit agencies. It includes the Proposer's record of conforming to specifications and standards of good workmanship. The Proposer's history for reasonable and cooperative behavior and commitment to member satisfaction shall be under evaluation. Ultimately, Past Performance Information can be defined as the Proposer's businesslike concern for the interests of the NJPA Member.

G. WAIVER OF FORMALITIES

<u>7.32</u> NJPA reserves the right to waive any minor formalities or irregularities in any proposal and to accept proposals, which, in its discretion and according to the law, may be in the best interest of its members.

8. POST AWARD OPERATING ISSUES

A. SUBSEQUENT AGREEMENTS

8.1 Purchase Order- Purchase Orders for goods and services may be executed between NJPA or NJPA Members (Purchaser) and awarded Vendor(s) or Vendor's sub-contractors pursuant to this invitation and any resulting Contract. NJPA Members are instructed to identify on the face of such Purchase orders that "This purchase order is issued pursuant to NJPA procurement contract #XXXXXX." A Purchase Order is

an offer to purchase goods and services at specified prices by NJPA or NJPA Members pursuant to a Contract resulting from this RFP. Purchase Order flow and procedure will be developed jointly between NJPA and an Awarded Vendor after an award is made.

- **8.2** Governing Law- Purchase Orders, as identified above, shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of a competent jurisdiction with respect to the purchaser. Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be included in the Purchase Order shall be read and enforced as though it were included. If through mistake or otherwise any such provision is not included, or is not currently included, then upon application of either part the Contract shall be physically amended to make such inclusion or correction. The venue for any litigation arising out of disputes related to Purchase Order(s) shall be a court of competent jurisdiction to the Purchaser.
- **8.3** Additional Terms and Conditions- Additional terms and conditions to a Purchase Order may be proposed by NJPA, NJPA Members, or Vendors. Acceptance of these additional terms and conditions is OPTIONAL to all parties to the Purchase Order. The purpose of these additional terms and conditions is to, among other things; formerly introduce job or industry specific requirements of law such as prevailing wage legislation. Additional terms and conditions can include specific local policy requirements and standard business practices of the issuing Member. Said additional terms and conditions shall not interfere with the general purpose and intent of this RFP.
- <u>8.4</u> Asset Management Contracts: Asset Management type contracts can be initiated pursuant to a Contract resulting from this RFP at any time during the term of said Contract. The establishment of such Asset Management Contracts cannot exceed the authorized term of a Contract resulting from this RFP; however the Asset Management Contract term may extend beyond the maturity date of a Contract resulting from this RFP.
- <u>8.5</u> Specialized Service Requirements- In the event service requirements or specialized performance requirements such as e-commerce specifications, specialized delivery requirements, or other specifications and requirements not addressed in the Contract resulting from this RFP, NJPA Member and Vendor may enter into a separate, standalone agreement, apart from a Contract resulting from this RFP. Any proposed service requirements or specialized performance requirements require pre-approval by Vendor. Any separate agreement developed to address these specialized service or performance requirements is exclusively between the NJPA Member and Vendor. NJPA, its agents, Members and employees shall not be made party to any claim for breach of such agreement. Product sourcing is not considered a service. NJPA Members will need to conduct procurements for any specialized services not identified in this Contract.
- <u>8.6</u> **Performance Bond-** At the request of the member, a Vendor will provide all performance bonds typically and customarily required in their industry. These bonds will be issued pursuant to the requirements of Purchase Orders for goods and services. If a purchase order is cancelled for lack of a required performance bond, it shall be the recommendation of NJPA that pending Purchase Orders with all NJPA Members be considered for cancellation. Each member has the final decision on Purchase Order continuation. ANY PERFORMANCE BONDING REQUIRED BY THE MEMBER OR CUSTOMER STATE LAWS OR LOCAL POLICY IS TO BE MUTUALLY AGREED UPON AND SECURED BETWEEN THE VENDOR AND THE CUSTOMER/MEMBER.

B. NJPA MEMBER SIGN-UP PROCEDURE

<u>8.7</u> Awarded Vendors will be responsible for familiarizing their sales and service forces with the various forms of NJPA Membership documentation and shall encourage and assist potential Members in establishing Membership

C. REPORTING OF SALE ACTIVITY

8.8 A report of the total gross dollar volume of all equipment/products and services purchased by NJPA

Members as it applies to this RFP and Contract will be provided quarterly to NJPA. The form and content of this reporting will be developed by NJPA in cooperation with the Vendor to include, but not limited to, name and address of purchasing agency, amount of purchase, and a description of the items purchased.

<u>8.8.1</u> Zero sales reports: Awarded Contractors are responsible for providing a quarterly sales report EVERY QUARTER regardless of the existence or amount of sales.

D. AUDITS

8.9 During the Term, Vendor will, upon not less than fourteen (14) business days' prior written request, make available to NJPA no more than once per calendar year, at Vendor's corporate offices, during normal business hours, the invoice reports and/or invoice documents from Vendor pertaining to all invoices sent by Vendor and payments made by NJPA members for all equipment/products and services purchased under this Contract. NJPA may employ an independent auditor or NJPA may choose to conduct such audit on its own behalf. Vendor shall have the right to approve the independent auditor, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. Upon approval and after the auditor has executed an appropriate confidentiality agreement, Vendor will permit the auditor to review the relevant Vendor documents. NJPA shall be responsible for paying the auditor's fees. The parties will make every reasonable effort to fairly and equitably resolve discrepancies to the satisfaction of both parties. Vendor agrees that the NJPA may audit their records with a reasonable notice to establish total compliance and to verify prices charged hereunder of the Contract are being met. Vendor agrees to provide verifiable documentation and tracking in a timely manner.

E. HUB PARTNER

8.10 Hub Partner: Where Applicable, NJPA Members may, from time to time, request to be served in some way through a "Hub Partner" for the purposes of complying with a Law, Regulation, or Rule to which that individual NJPA Member deems to be applicable in their jurisdiction. Hub Partners may bring value to the proposed transactions through consultancy, Disadvantaged Business Entity Credits, or other considerations.

8.11 Hub Partner Fees: Fees, costs, or expenses from this Hub Partner levied upon a transaction resulting from this contract, shall be payable by the NJPA Member provide that:

8.11.1 The fees, costs, or expenses levied by the Hub Vendor must be clearly itemized in the transaction. and

8.11.2 To the extent that the he Vendor stands in the chain of title during a transaction resulting from this RFP, the documentation shall be documented to show it is "Executed for the Benefit of [NJPA Member Name]".

F. TRADE-INS

8.12 Where Appropriate, the value in US Dollars, of Trade-ins will be negotiated between NJPA or an NJPA Member, and an Awarded Vendor. That identified "Trade-In" value shall be credited in full against the NJPA purchase price identified in a purchase order issued pursuant to any Awarded NJPA procurement contract. The full value of the trade-in will be consideration to that purchase order.

G. OUT OF STOCK NOTIFICATION

8.13 Vendor shall immediately notify NJPA members upon receipt of order(s) when an out-of -stock occurs. Vendor shall inform the NJPA member regarding the anticipated date of availability for the out-of-stock item(s), and may suggest equivalent substitute(s).

- The ordering organization shall have the option of accepting the suggested equivalent substitute, or canceling the item from the order.
- Under no circumstance is Proposer permitted to make unauthorized substitutions.
- Unfilled or substituted item(s) shall be indicated on the packing list.

H. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT RESULTING FROM THIS RFP

- **8.14** NJPA reserves the right to cancel the whole or any part of a resulting Contract due to failure by the Vendor to carry out any obligation, term or condition as described in the below procedure. Prior to any termination for cause, the NJPA will provide written notice to the Vendor, opportunity to respond and opportunity to cure according to the steps in the procedure in this Cancellation Section. Some examples of material breach are the following:
 - The Vendor provides material that does not meet reasonable quality standards and is not remedied under the warranty;
 - The Vendor fails to ship the products or provide the services within a reasonable amount of time:
 - NJPA has reason to believe the Vendor will not or cannot perform to the requirements of the Contract and issues a request for assurance as described herein and Vendor fails to respond;
 - The Vendor fails to observe any of the material terms and conditions of the Contract; and/or,
 - The Vendor fails to follow the established procedure for purchase orders, invoices and/or receipt of funds as established by the NJPA and the Vendor in the Contract.
 - The Vendor fails to report quarterly sales volume;
 - The Vendor fails to actively market this Contract within the guidelines provided in this RFP and the expectations of NJPA.
- **8.15** Each party shall follow the below procedure if the Contract is to be terminated for violations or non-performance issues:
 - **Step 1:** Issue a warning letter outlining the violations and/or non-performance and state the length of time (10 days) to provide a response and correct the problem(s) if reasonably possible in such time frame.
 - **Step 2:** Issue a letter of intent to cancel Contract, if the problem(s) is not resolved within fifty (50) days.
 - **Step 3:** Issue letter to cancel Contract for cause.
- **8.16** Upon receipt of the written notice of concern, the Vendor shall have ten (10) business days to provide a satisfactory response to the NJPA. Failure on the part of the Vendor to reasonably address all issues of concern may result in Contract cancellation pursuant to this Section.
- **8.17** Any termination shall have no effect on purchases that are in progress at the time the cancellation is received by the NJPA. The NJPA reserves the right to cancel the Contract immediately for convenience, without penalty or recourse, in the event the Vendor is not responsive concerning the remedy, the performance, or the violation issue within the time frame, completely or in part.
- **8.18** NJPA reserves the right to cancel or suspend the use of any Contract resulting from this RFP if the Vendor files for bankruptcy protection or is acquired by an independent third party. Prior to commencing services under this Contract, the Proposer/Vendor must furnish NJPA certification from insurer(s) proving level of coverage usual and customary to the specific industry. The coverage is to be maintained in full effect during the Contract period. Vendor must be willing to provide, upon request, certification of insurance to any NJPA member or member using this Contract.
- **8.19** Either party may execute Contract termination without cause with a required 60-day written notice of termination. Termination of Contract shall not relieve either party of financial, product or service obligations incurred or accrued prior to termination.

8.20 NJPA may cancel any Contract resulting from this solicitation without any further obligation if any NJPA employee significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating the Contract on behalf of the NJPA is found to be in collusion with any Proposer to this RFP for their personal gain. Such cancellation shall be effective upon written notice from the NJPA or a later date if so designated in the notice given. A terminated Contract shall not relieve either party of financial, product or service obligations due to participating member or NJPA.

8.21 Events of Automatic termination to include:

- Vendor's or NJPA's voluntary or involuntary bankruptcy or insolvency;
- Vendor's failure to remedy a material breach of a Contract resulting from this RFP within sixty (60) days of receipt of notice from NJPA specifying in reasonable detail the nature of such breach; and/or,
- Receipt of written information from any authorized agency finding activities of Vendors engaged in pursuant to a Contract resulting from this RFP to be in violation of the law.

9. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. ADVERTISEMENT OF RFP

9.1 As a policy, NJPA shall advertise this solicitation 1) for two consecutive weeks in both the print and on-line editions of the MINNEAPOLIS STAR TRIBUNE, 2) it shall be placed on a national wire service by the MINNEAPOLIS STAR TRIBUNE, 3) it shall be posted on NJPA's website, 4) it shall be posted to the website of "Noticetobidders.com," and 5) it shall be posted to other third-party websites deemed appropriate by NJPA. Other third party advertisers may include Onvia and Bidsync,

B. ADVERTISING OF A CONTRACT RESULTING FROM THIS RFP

<u>9.2</u> Proposer/Vendor shall not advertise or publish information concerning this Contract prior to the award being announced by the NJPA. Once the award is made, a Vendor is expected to advertise the awarded Contract to both current and potential NJPA Members.

C. APPLICABLE LAW

- <u>9.3</u> NJPA Compliance with Minnesota Procurement Law: Contracts awarded through NJPA are intended to meet the procurement laws of all states and NJPA will exhaust all avenues to comply with as many state laws as possible. It is the responsibility of each participating NJPA member to insure to their satisfaction that these laws are satisfied. An individual NJPA member using these contracts is deemed by their own accord to be in compliance with proposal regulations. NJPA encourages the awarded Vendor to assist NJPA and the NJPA member in this research to the benefit of all involved.
- <u>9.4</u> Governing Law with respect to delivery and acceptance: All applicable portions of the Minnesota Uniform Commercial Code, all other applicable Minnesota laws, and the applicable laws and rules of delivery and inspection of the Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) laws shall govern contracts resulting from this solicitation.
- <u>9.5</u> **Jurisdiction:** Any claims pertaining to this RFP and any resulting Contract that develop between NJPA and any other party must be brought forth only in courts in Todd County in the State of Minnesota.
 - <u>9.5.1</u> Purchase Orders issued pursuant to a contract resulting from this solicitation shall be construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of a competent jurisdiction with respect to the purchaser.
- **9.6 Vendor Compliance with applicable law:** Vendor(s) shall comply with all federal, state, or local

laws applicable to or pertaining to the acquisition, manufacturer, or sale of the equipment/products and services resulting from this RFP.

- <u>9.7</u> All applicable laws, whether or not herein contained, shall be included by this reference. It shall be Proposer's/Vendor's responsibility to determine the applicability and requirements of any such laws and to abide by them.
- <u>9.8</u> Indemnity: Each party agrees it will be responsible for its own acts and the result thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of the other party and the results thereof. NJPA's liability shall be governed by the provisions of the Minnesota Tort Claims Act, Minnesota Statutes, Section §3.736, and other applicable law.
- <u>9.9</u> Prevailing Wage: It shall be the responsibility of the Vendor to comply, when applicable, with prevailing wage legislation in effect in the jurisdiction of the purchaser (NJPA or NJPA Member). It shall be the responsibility of the Vendor to monitor the prevailing wage rates as established by the appropriate department of labor for any increase in rates during the term of this Contract and adjust wage rates accordingly.
- <u>9.10</u> Patent and Copyright infringement: If an article sold and delivered to NJPA or NJPA Members hereunder shall be protected by any applicable patent or copyright, the Vendor agrees to indemnify and save harmless NJPA and NJPA Members against any and all suits, claims, judgments, and costs instituted or recovered against it by any person whosoever on account of the use or sale of such articles by NJPA or NJPA Members in violation or right under such patent or copyright.

D. ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT

- <u>9.11</u> No right or interest in this Contract shall be assigned or transferred by the Proposer/Vendor without prior written permission by the NJPA. No delegation of any duty of the Proposer/Vendor shall be made without prior written permission of the NJPA. The NJPA shall notify the members within fifteen (15) days of receipt of written notice by the Vender. After issuance the awarded Contract may be reassigned to a comparable Vendor at the discretion of NJPA.
- **9.12** If the original Vendor sells or transfers all assets or the entire portion of the assets used to perform this Contract, a successor in interest must guarantee to perform all obligations under this Contract. NJPA reserves the right to reject the acquiring person or entity as a Vendor. A simple change of name agreement will not change the contractual obligations of the Vendor.

E. PROPOSERS LIST

<u>9.13</u> NJPA will not maintain or communicate to a proposers list. All interested proposers must respond to the solicitation as a result of one of the methods of proposal advertisements listed above. Because of the scope of the potential Members and national Vendors, NJPA has determined this to be the best method of fairly soliciting proposals.

F. CAPTIONS, HEADINGS, AND ILLUSTRATIONS

<u>9.14</u> The captions, illustrations, headings, and subheadings in this solicitation are for convenience and ease of understanding and in no way define or limit the scope or intent of this request.

G. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

<u>9.15</u> If a Proposer wishes to withhold any part of its proposal from public inspection, then a statement advising the NJPA of this fact shall accompany the submission. NJPA shall review the statement, from time to time, to determine whether the information can be legally withheld. If NJPA determines at any point, that disclosure the information submitted is required by law, NJPA reserves the right to make that

disclosure.

H. DATA PRIVACY

9.16 Proposer agrees to abide by all applicable STATE and FEDERAL laws and regulations including HIPPA concerning the handling and disclosure of private and confidential information regarding individuals. Proposer agrees to hold NJPA harmless from its unlawful disclosure and/or use of private/confidential information.

I. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

- <u>9.17</u> The Contract, as defined herein, shall constitute the entire understanding between the parties to that Contract.
- **9.16** A Contract resulting from this RFP is formed when the NJPA Board of Directors approves and signs the applicable <u>Acceptance and Award Form</u> document (see Form D).

J. FORCE MAJEURE

9.18 Except for payments of sums due, neither party shall be liable to the other nor deemed in default under this Contract if and to the extent that such party's performance of this Contract is prevented due to force majeure. The term "force majeure" means an occurrence that is beyond the control of the party affected and occurs without its fault or negligence including, but not limited to, the following: acts of God, acts of the public enemy, war, riots, strikes, mobilization, labor disputes, civil disorders, fire, flood, snow, earthquakes, tornadoes or violent wind, tsunamis, wind shears, squalls, Chinooks, blizzards, hail storms, volcanic eruptions, meteor strikes, famine, sink holes, avalanches, lockouts, injunctionsintervention-acts, terrorist events or failures or refusals to act by government authority and/or other similar occurrences where such party is unable to prevent by exercising reasonable diligence. The force majeure shall be deemed to commence when the party declaring force majeure notifies the other party of the existence of the force majeure and shall be deemed to continue as long as the results or effects of the force majeure prevent the party from resuming performance in accordance with a Contract resulting from this RFP. Force majeure shall not include late deliveries of equipment/products and servicescaused by congestion at a manufacturer's plant or elsewhere, an oversold condition of the market, inefficiencies, or other similar occurrences. If either party is delayed at any time by force majeure, then the delayed party shall notify the other party of such delay within forty-eight (48) hours.

K. GRATUITIES

9.19 NJPA may cancel this Contract by written notice if it is found that gratuities, in the form of entertainment, gifts or otherwise, were offered or given by the Proposer/Vendor or any agent or representative of the Proposer/Vendor, to any employee of the NJPA are deemed to be excessive with a view toward securing a contract or with respect to the performance of this Contract.

L. HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

<u>9.20</u> Proper Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS), in compliance with OSHA's Hazard Communication Standard, must be provided by the Vendor to NJPA or NJPA Member at the time of purchase.

M. LEGAL REMEDIES

<u>9.21</u> All claims and controversies between NJPA and Vendor shall be subject to the laws of the State of Minnesota and are to be resolved in Todd County, Minnesota, the county in which NJPA is domiciled.

N. LICENSES
